BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

- SECTION 1. [NEW MATERIAL] TRIBAL EDUCATION TRUST

  FUND--CREATED--PURPOSE--DISTRIBUTION--REPORTING REQUIREMENTS-
  PUBLIC EDUCATION DEPARTMENT DUTIES--APPROPRIATION.--
- A. The "tribal education trust fund" is created as a nonreverting fund in the state treasury. The tribal education trust fund shall be used for any purpose enumerated in Section 22-23A-2 NMSA 1978 or in an intergovernmental agreement between an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo and the public education department. The fund consists of distributions, appropriations, gifts, grants and donations. Income from investment of the fund shall be credited to the fund. Money in the fund shall be expended only as provided in this section.
- B. The state investment officer shall invest money in the tribal education trust fund in accordance with the prudent investor rule set forth in the Uniform Prudent Investor Act.
- C. The state investment officer shall report quarterly to the legislative education study committee and the state investment council on the investments made pursuant to this section. Beginning in fiscal year 2025, a report shall be submitted no later than October 1 each year to the legislative education study committee and any other appropriate interim committees.
- D. Beginning in fiscal year 2026, a distribution .226731.3AIC February 3, 2024 (2:04pm)

shall be made from the tribal education trust fund to the public education department on July 1 of each year in which adequate money is available in the tribal education trust fund Hf11→as follows:

(1) for fiscal years 2026 through 2030, in an amount equal to five percent of the year-end market value of the fund for the immediately preceding calendar year; and

(2) for fiscal year 2031 and each subsequent fiscal year, ←Hfll in an amount equal to HEC→the greater of twelve million five hundred thousand dollars (\$12,500,000) or ←HEC five percent of the average of the year-end market values of the tribal education trust fund for the preceding five calendar years Hfll→; provided that the public education department shall distribute funding received pursuant to this subsection according to the formula developed pursuant to Section 2 of this 2024 act. ←Hfll Hfll→. ←Hfll

The public education department shall distribute the annual funding from the tribal education trust fund distributions as provided in Subsection D of this section to New Mexico tribes according to an equitable formula that considers Native American student populations and tribal education capacity needs and is developed in a unanimous consensus process of consultation, collaboration and communication with New Mexico tribes by June 1, 2025, with the

option of appointing peacemakers in the event of a dispute regarding the formula.←Hfll

 $Hf11 \rightarrow E$ . ←Hf11  $Hf11 \rightarrow F$ . ←Hf11 In addition to the distribution pursuant to Subsection D of this section, money in the tribal education trust fund may be expended in the event that general fund balances, including all authorized revenues and transfers to the general fund and balances in the general fund operating reserve, the appropriation contingency fund, the tobacco settlement permanent fund, the state-support reserve fund and the tax stabilization reserve, will not meet the level of appropriations authorized from the general fund for a fiscal year. In that event, to avoid an unconstitutional deficit, the legislature may appropriate from the tribal education trust fund to the general fund only in the amount necessary to meet general fund appropriations for that fiscal year and only if the legislature has authorized transfers from the appropriation contingency fund, the general fund operating reserve, the tax stabilization reserve and the tobacco settlement permanent fund that exhaust those fund balances.

A. The "tribal education trust fund disbursement formula task force" is created within the public education department. The task force shall function from the date of its appointment, which shall be no later than December 1, 2024, until July 1, 2031. The legislative education study committee shall transmit the proposal to the public education department. The public education department shall solicit and accept task force appointments pursuant to that proposal and convene the task force pursuant to Subsection A of this section. ► HEC ← HIFT!

HAFC SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the tribal education trust fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2025 and subsequent fiscal years to carry out the purpose of the tribal education trust fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund. CHAFC
