"61-17A-22. EXEMPTIONS.--The following persons are exempt from the provisions of the Barbers and Cosmetologists Act while in the discharge of their professional duties:

- A. persons licensed by the law of this state to practice medicine and surgery or chiropractic;
- B. commissioned medical or surgical officers of the United States army, navy STBTC→~~or~~←STBTC STBTC→, ←STBTC marine STBTC→~~or~~ air force←STBTC hospital service;
- C. registered nurses;
- D. funeral service practitioners; [~~and~~]
- E. persons providing only eyebrow-threading services; and
- F. persons who are employed as make-up artists or hairstylists STBTC→~~in motion picture~~←STBTC STBTC→~~for~~ ~~theatrical or cinematic~~←STBTC productions."
