12	PERIOD FOR THE SALE OF FIREARMS DOES NOT APPLY TO A BUYER WHO
13	IS NOT DISQUALIFIED FROM POSSESSING A FIREARM AND WHO IS A
14	CERTIFIED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, A FORMER OR RETIRED
15	CERTIFIED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, A COMMISSIONED LAW
16	ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF AN INDIAN
17	NATION, TRIBE OR PUEBLO.

19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
20	SECTION 1. Section 30-7-7.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2024,
21	Chapter 46, Section 1) is amended to read:
22	"30-7-7.3. UNLAWFUL SALE OF A FIREARM BEFORE REQUIRED
23	WAITING PERIOD ENDS
24	A. A waiting period of seven calendar days shall be
25	required for the sale of a firearm and the transfer of the

The seven-calendar-day waiting period 2 shall include the period required to conduct a federal instant 3 background check; provided that, if the seven-calendar-day 4 waiting period has expired without the completion of a required 5 federal instant background check, the seller shall not transfer the firearm to the buyer until the federal instant background 6 7 check is completed. If the required federal instant background 8 check has not been completed within twenty days, the seller may 9 transfer the firearm to the buyer.

B. The firearm shall remain in the custody of the seller or the federal firearms licensee performing the federal instant background check during the entirety of the waiting period.

C. Unlawful sale of a firearm before the required waiting period ends consists of the transfer of ownership, possession or physical control of the firearm from the seller to the buyer before the end of the required seven-calendar-day waiting period, but does not include temporary possession or control of a firearm provided to a customer by the proprietor of a licensed business in the conduct of that business.

D. Each party to an unlawful sale of a firearm before the required waiting period ends is in violation of this section and may be separately charged for the same sale.

E. Each firearm sold contrary to the provisions of this section constitutes a separate offense under Subsection C .230835.1 - 2 -
