15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SHORT TITLEThis act may be
17	cited as the "Strategic Economic Development Site Readiness
18	Act".
19	SECTION 2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DEFINITIONSAs used in the
20	Strategic Economic Development Site Readiness Act:
21	A. "department" means the economic development
22	department;
23	B. "private partner" means an individual, a foreign
24	or domestic corporation, a general partnership, a limited
25	liability company, a limited partnership, a joint venture, a
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business trust, a public benefit corporation, a nonprofit entity or other private business entity or a combination thereof;

C. "public partner" means the state and the state's branches, agencies, departments, boards, instrumentalities or institutions and all political subdivisions of the state and their agencies, instrumentalities and institutions, including a department, an institution of higher education, a board or a commission; and

10 D. "secretary" means the secretary of economic 11 development.

SECTION 3. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SITE CHARACTERIZATION STUDIES.--

A. The department may enter into contracts with public partners and private partners for site characterization studies of proposed economic development sites to determine the suitability of such sites for certification as a strategic economic development site.

B. The secretary shall accept for consideration proposals for site characterization studies of proposed economic development sites and shall decide if a proposed economic development site will be the subject of a site characterization study pursuant to Subsection A of this section.

C. A site characterization study shall assess the .230567.1

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1	suitability of a proposed economic development site for
2	development by a public partner or private partner and may
3	consider the following characteristics:
4	(1) the availability of public infrastructure,
5	including transportation access, water and wastewater;
6	(2) the availability of public utilities,
7	including electricity, natural gas and broadband access;
8	(3) environmental limitations;
9	(4) size, configuration, topography, soils and
10	drainage;
11	(5) workforce availability;
12	(6) housing availability;
13	(7) governmental land use restrictions;
14	(8) site ownership;
15	(9) neighboring land uses; and
16	(10) any other site characteristics that may
17	affect the degree to which the site is ready for immediate
18	economic development.
19	SECTION 4. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] STRATEGIC ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
20	SITE ADVISORY COMMITTEECREATEDMEMBERSHIP
21	A. The "strategic economic development site
22	advisory committee" is created. The department shall provide
23	necessary administrative services to the committee.
24	B. The strategic economic development site advisory
25	committee is composed of:
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1	(1) the secretary of energy, minerals and
2	natural resources or the secretary's designee;
3	(2) the secretary of environment or the
4	secretary's designee;
5	(3) a representative of the public regulation
6	commission appointed by the commission;
7	(4) the secretary of transportation or the
8	secretary's designee;
9	(5) the chief executive officer of the New
10	Mexico finance authority or the chief executive officer's
11	designee;
12	(6) the director of the economic development
13	division of the department; and
14	(7) five public members appointed by the New
15	Mexico legislative council who shall have experience in law,
16	architecture, planning, utilities, transportation or economic
17	development.
18	C. The public members appointed initially shall
19	draw lots for staggered terms in such a way that two members
20	shall serve for six years, two members shall serve for four
21	years and one member shall serve for two years. Thereafter,
22	the public members shall serve for six-year terms. A vacancy
23	in a term of a public member of the strategic economic
24	development site advisory committee shall be filled by the New
25	Mexico legislative council for the remainder of the original
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term.

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D. The members shall select a chair, who shall be a public member and who shall serve a term of two years.

E. Members who are not public employees are entitled to per diem and mileage as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act but shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.

F. A member of the strategic economic development site advisory committee shall not participate in or influence a decision by the committee in which that member has a conflict of interest, pecuniary interest or other disqualifying interest regarding a proposed strategic economic development site. All members of the committee shall certify annually and in writing compliance with this subsection.

SECTION 5. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] STRATEGIC ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SITE ADVISORY COMMITTEE--DUTIES.--The strategic economic development site advisory committee has the following duties:

A. meet quarterly and at such other times as deemed necessary by the chair;

B. review and recommend the designation of proposed strategic economic development sites;

C. recommend approval or disapproval of applications for grants and loans from the site readiness fund, the public project revolving fund and other potential funding sources;

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1 D. recommend the promulgation of rules establishing 2 the application process and criteria for the approval of 3 strategic economic development sites in accordance with the 4 provisions of the State Rules Act; and 5 consult with state agencies and county and local Ε. 6 governments on technical issues relevant to the committee's 7 consideration of proposed strategic economic development sites 8 and applications for grants and loans from the site readiness 9 fund. 10 SECTION 6. [NEW MATERIAL] STRATEGIC ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT 11 SITES--DESIGNATION--IMPLEMENTATION.--12 The secretary shall review site characterization Α. 13 studies conducted pursuant to Section 3 of the Strategic 14 Economic Development Site Readiness Act and shall determine, 15 after consideration of the recommendations of the strategic 16 economic development site advisory committee: 17 (1) whether there needs to be further study of 18 the characteristics of proposed economic development sites; or 19 (2) whether the proposed economic development 20 site should be designated as a strategic economic development 21 site. 22 Β. Upon designation as a strategic economic 23 development site, the secretary may solicit proposals from 24 public partners and private partners for site pre-development 25 projects that will enhance the readiness of the strategic .230567.1

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1	economic development site. Site pre-development projects may
2	include:
3	(1) surveying, engineering, planning and
4	architectural work required in advance of construction on site
5	development and building construction;
6	(2) environmental assessments and remediation;
7	(3) public infrastructure improvements
8	necessary prior to the start of site development and building
9	construction, including roads and utilities;
10	(4) site preparation, including landscaping
11	and drainage improvements; and
12	(5) governmental permitting.
13	C. The secretary shall review proposals from public
14	partners and private partners for site pre-development projects
15	and shall determine, after consideration of the recommendations
16	of the strategic economic development site advisory committee,
17	which proposed site pre-development projects could be funded in
18	whole or in part by grants and loans from the site readiness
19	fund or should be recommended for funding from the public
20	project revolving fund or other funding resources.
21	SECTION 7. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SITE READINESS FUNDCREATED
22	A. The "site readiness fund" is created in the
23	state treasury. The fund consists of appropriations, gifts,
24	grants, donations, income from investment of the fund, payments
25	of principal and interest on loans made from the fund and any
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other money distributed or otherwise allocated to the fund. Income from the fund shall be credited to the fund. Money in the fund shall not revert or be transferred to any other fund at the end of a fiscal year.

The department shall administer the site Β. readiness fund. Money in the fund is appropriated to the 7 department for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of 8 the Strategic Economic Development Site Readiness Act, 9 including site characteristic studies of proposed economic 10 development sites and site preparations of strategic economic 11 development sites. Disbursements from the fund shall be made 12 by warrant of the secretary of finance and administration 13 pursuant to vouchers signed by the secretary of economic 14 development or the secretary's authorized representative.

C. Money in the site readiness fund may be used to provide grants and loans for financing site predevelopment projects.

D. Money in the site readiness fund may be used for administrative and reimbursable costs incurred by the department, subject to the legislative appropriation process.

SECTION 8. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] REPORT.--By October 1, 2026, and by October 1 of each year thereafter, the secretary shall provide a report to the governor, the legislative finance committee and the appropriate interim legislative committees regarding:

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1 the number and location of proposed economic Α. 2 development sites that have been approved for site 3 characterization studies; 4 Β. the number and location of strategic economic 5 development sites that have been approved by the secretary; 6 C. the number and location of site pre-development 7 projects that have been approved by the secretary, including 8 those that have been approved for funding, in whole or in part, 9 through grants and loans from the site readiness fund, the 10 public project revolving fund or other funding resources; the status of the site readiness fund; and 11 D. 12 Ε. recommended changes to the Strategic Economic 13 Development Site Readiness Act. 14 **SECTION 9.** APPROPRIATION.--Twenty-four million dollars 15 (\$24,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the site 16 readiness fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2026 and 17 subsequent fiscal years for the implementation of the Strategic 18 Economic Development Site Readiness Act. Any unexpended or 19 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year 20 shall not revert to the general fund. SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the 21 22 provisions of this act is July 1, 2025. - 9 -23 24 25

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
