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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. Section 1-6-5.7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005,
17	Chapter 270, Section 40, as amended) is amended to read:

21	A. Commencing on the [twenty-eighth] <u>fifteenth</u> day
22	preceding the election during the regular hours and days of
23	business at the county clerk's office and on the third Saturday
24	[immediately] prior to the date of the election, early voting
25	shall be conducted in each office of the county clerk; provided

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(1)when marking a ballot in person at the county clerk's office, the voter shall provide the required voter identification to the county clerk or the clerk's authorized representative. If the voter does not provide the required voter identification, the voter shall be allowed to vote on a provisional ballot. If the voter provides the 8 required voter identification, the voter, after subscribing an application for an absentee ballot, shall be allowed to vote by 10 inserting the ballot into an optical scan tabulator certified for in-person absentee voting at the county clerk's office. 12 The county clerk or the clerk's authorized representative shall make an appropriate designation indicating that the voter has In marking the ballot, the voter may be assisted voted. pursuant to the provisions of Section 1-12-15 NMSA 1978;

the act of marking the ballot in the (2) office of the county clerk shall be a convenience to the voter in the delivery of the ballot and does not make the office of the county clerk a polling place subject to the requirements of a polling place in the Election Code;

in addition to the [regular business hours (3) and] days of business of the county clerk's office and on the [Saturday] three Saturdays immediately prior to the date of the election, early voting [may] shall be conducted in each office of the county clerk [no earlier than] beginning at 7:00 a.m. .230720.1

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and shall close [no later than 9:00] at 7:00 p.m. and shall be 2 available for [at least eight] twelve consecutive hours each 3 day; and not later than ninety days before each statewide election, the county clerk shall post the location and hours of operation at the county clerk's office and shall not modify the location or hours of operation of early voting at the county clerk's office [except with the written approval of the 8 secretary of state and upon posting the approved changes]; and

if the county clerk establishes an (4) additional alternate voting location near the clerk's office, ballots may be marked in person at that location during the regular [hours and] days of business beginning on the [twentyeighth] fifteenth day preceding the election and during the hours for voting at alternate voting locations commencing on the third Saturday prior to the election through the Saturday immediately prior to the election. The additional alternate voting location may be operated by the county clerk and the county clerk's staff.

Β. Commencing on the third Saturday prior to a statewide election and ending on the Saturday immediately prior to the date of the election, an early voter may vote in person on a voting system at alternate voting locations that may be established by the county clerk; provided that:

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(1) the county clerk shall establish: (a) in counties with more than ten

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1 thousand voters, not fewer than one alternate voting location; 2 (b) in counties with more than fifty 3 thousand voters, not fewer than four alternate voting 4 locations; and (c) in counties with more than one 5 hundred fifty thousand voters, not fewer than fifteen alternate 6 7 voting locations; and 8 (2) not later than ninety days before each 9 statewide election, the county clerk shall post the location 10 and hours of operation for early voting locations in the 11 county, which shall open no earlier than 7:00 a.m. and shall 12 close no later than [9:00] 7:00 p.m. [Within ninety days of a statewide election, a county clerk shall not modify the 13 14 location or hours of operation of early voting locations except 15 with the written approval of the secretary of state and upon 16 posting the approved changes] Early voting locations shall be 17 open each day of early voting for [at least eight] twelve 18 consecutive hours. [Alternate voting locations may be closed 19 Sundays and Mondays during the early voting period] 20 Each early voting location shall comply with the С. 21 following provisions, unless the county clerk receives a 22 written waiver from the secretary of state specifying the 23 location and specific provision being waived: 24 (1) have ballots available for voters from 25 every precinct in the county;

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1 (2) have at least one optical scan tabulator programmed to read every ballot style in the county; 2 3 (3) have at least one voting system available to assist disabled voters to cast and record their votes; 4 5 (4) have a broadband internet connection; 6 (5) have sufficient spaces for at least five 7 voters to simultaneously and privately mark their ballots, with 8 at least one of those spaces wheelchair-accessible; 9 (6) have a secure area for storage of pre-10 printed ballots or for storage of a paper ballot stock and a 11 system designed to print ballots at a polling location; and 12 (7) be in a location that is accessible and 13 compliant with the requirements of the federal Americans with 14 Disabilities Act of 1990. 15 When voting at an early voting location, the D. 16 voter shall provide the required voter identification to the 17 election board, county clerk or the clerk's authorized 18 representative. If the voter does not provide the required 19 voter identification, the voter shall be allowed to vote on a 20 provisional ballot. If the voter provides the required voter 21 identification, the voter shall be allowed to vote after 22 subscribing an application to vote on a form approved by the 23 secretary of state or its electronic equivalent approved by the 24 voting system certification committee. The county clerk or the 25 clerk's authorized representative shall make an appropriate .230720.1
