SUMMARY

Synopsis of House Bill 366

House Bill 366 (HB366) proposes to include veterinarians in the definition of "health care practitioner" under the Health Care Practitioner Agreements provisions to bring veterinarians under the professional employment agreement safeguards offered by the health care code. The bill would add veterinarians to the professions for which noncompete provisions are unenforceable.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill does not contain a direct fiscal impact.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The bill could assist in recruiting and retaining veterinarians to the state.
