SUMMARY

Synopsis of Senate Bill 160

Senate Bill 160 appropriates \$20 million from the general fund to DFA's Local Government Division for the expenditure in FY25 and subsequent years. The purpose is for the City of Albuquerque to use the funding to restore the Rio Grande Valley state park in Bernalillo County.

This bill does not contain an effective date and, as a result, would go into effect 90 days after the Legislature adjourns, or May 15, 2024, if enacted.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$20 million contained in this bill is a nonrecurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY25 shall not revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Rio Grande Valley state park is 4,300 acres, which extends from Sandia Pueblo in the north through Albuquerque and south to Isleta Pueblo. NMTD stated that improvement of the properties within the Rio Grande Valley state park could be beneficial for tourism opportunities for the City of Albuquerque and the state of New Mexico.

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
