Acequia Bureau Major Activities

- Administer all Capital Outlay Appropriations for Acequias
 - 2019 67 Projects (\$6,927,216)
 - 2020 72 Projects (\$4,620,450)
 - 2021 30 Projects (\$2,743,500)
 - 2022 57 Projects (\$5,562,800)
 - 2023 56 Projects (\$5,589,275)

Acequia Bureau Major Activities

- Administration of the new Acequia and Community Ditch Infrastructure Fund (ACDIF) to provide planning, engineering design, construction, and disaster relief funding to acequias and community ditches for their infrastructure needs
- Partners with the New Mexico Association of Conservation Districts (NMACD) Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) to provide technical and financial assistance to acequia projects statewide
- Determine eligibility of acequias/community ditches for funding
- Review and accept acequia project designs, prepare funding agreements, perform field inspections, track progress of projects, and process reimbursement payment requests for work completed
- Collaborate with NMACD RCPP and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in spending approximately \$8M in federal funding
- Provide education and outreach to acequias on funding programs through workshops
- Provide Technical Assistance to NMISC Chair who sits on the Acequia and Community Ditch Fund Act Committee (ACDF)



2023 NM Legislative Session Senate Bill 176

- Amended the Acequia and Community Ditch Infrastructure
 Fund Act that was passed during the 2019 Legislative
 Session to include the following:
 - Provide funding for disaster response recovery and hazard mitigation;
 - Remove local cost share requirements; and,
 - Match or meet cost share requirements of other state and federal funding programs;
- Guideline revisions have been drafted in collaboration with the New Mexico Acequia Commission and the New Mexico Acequia Association and will be presented at the July 20th NMISC Meeting for adoption.
