YDI is comprised of 4 service Divisions:

1) Early Childhood Education & Family Development

Early childhood education, family development services, and childcare for children and parents prenatal to 5 years old. Operates 29 Head Start Centers in Bernalillo, Taos & Rio Arriba Counties in addition to Home Visitation and Nurse Family Partnership services to support parents.

2) Prevention, Intervention & Behavioral Health

Provides an array of services to help children and families stay healthy, gain valuable and necessary life skills and have a safe living environment through crisis intervention, transitional living, behavioral health, Child First and many more.

3) Education, Employment & Training

Empowers youth & adults to address barriers, complete their education, gain workplace and occupational skills (WIOA, Youth Build), decrease violence behavior or engagement, and develop positive relationships for healthy lifestyles & self-sufficiency.

4) Administration & Development

Early Childhood Education & Family Development



- **Programs:** Comprised of 7 programs
- **Number of Staff:** ~300 funded full-time positions
- **Counties Served:** Bernalillo, Sandoval, Rio Arriba, Torrance, Sandoval, and Taos
- **Services:** Services range from center-based childcare to early childhood development, home visitation and Nurse Family Partnership services.
- **Age range:** Prenatal to 5 years

Early Childhood Education & Family Development



- **Head Start**– 3 to 5 years- Center-based childcare that promotes the school readiness of children ages 3-5 from low-income families by enhancing their cognitive, social, and emotional development. Bernalillo, Taos, Rio Arriba Counties
- **Early Head Start**- 6 weeks to 3 years- The EHS center-based program provides comprehensive child development and family support services to low-income infants and toddlers and their families. Bernalillo, Taos, Rio Arriba Counties
- **New Mexico PreK- 3years to 5 years**- The NM PreK program is state funded and provides center-based services to children and their families of any income level. Bernalillo County
- **Pregnant Women's Program**–YDI's Pregnant Women's Program provides free home visitation services and information to future moms during pregnancy. Bernalillo & Taos Counties
- **Early Head Start Home Visitation**– ages 0-3 years- Provides family-centered services for low-income families. This program is designed to promote the development of the children and to enable their parents to fulfill their roles as parents and to move toward self-sufficiency. Bernalillo & Taos Counties
- **ECECD State Home Visitation** -ages prenatal to 5 years- Provides family center services to families of any income level using a research-based curriculum. Meets in the family's home one time per month. Bernalillo, Rio Arriba, and Sandoval Counties
- **Nurse Family Partnership Home Visitation**- Prenatal to 2 years - With their very own free nurse, parents will get the support, advice, and information they need during their pregnancy and when their baby arrives. Bernalillo, Rio Arriba, Sandoval, and Torraine. This is a National evidence-based program.

Prevention, Intervention & Behavioral Health (PIBH)

The PIBH Division provides services for children, youth, and families to teach them to stay healthy, gain valuable and necessary life skills, and have a safe living environment.

We meet clients where they are at and we support them through life's challenges.

We provide homeless assistance, transitional living services, case management, crisis intervention, comprehensive community support, and individual and family counseling.



Prevention, Intervention & Behavioral Health (PIBH)

- **Programs:** PIBH is comprised of 22 programs
- **Number of Staff:** There are 123 funded staff positions
- **Counties served include** Bernalillo, Sandoval, Valencia, Tarrant, Cibola, Eddy, and Santa Fe
- **Services:** Services range from adolescent pregnancy prevention to residential programs for youth/young adults and school/outpatient-based counseling and case management programs. Ages served are from 0 to senior adults.



Prevention, Intervention & Behavioral Health (PIBH)

Outreach Programs



- **Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)** – infants and children (Ages 0-12)
- **Community-Based Prevention, Intervention, Reunification (CBPIR)** – Family support services (Families with children ages 0-18)
- **Community Engagement Team (CET)** – Peer Support Workers provide short-term intervention and stabilization for all ages.
- **Individual and Family Counseling** – for Medicaid clients
- **Independent Futures (IF)** – Case management services with a focus on housing (Ages 16-24).
- **Neutral Corner** – Providing supervised visitation and exchange services.

Prevention, Intervention & Behavioral Health (PIBH)

Amistad Crisis Shelter: Short-term emergency shelter services (14-30 days, Ages 12-17)

Casa Hermosa: Transitional living services for unhoused youth (Ages 16-21)

Casa North: Housing for youth involved with child welfare, juvenile justice, and tribal social services (Ages 16-23)

Summer House: Crisis-driven to support unhoused youth involved with the child welfare system (Ages 12-17)

Flora Vista: Provides transitional living services to young adults aging out of foster care, youth shelters, or re-entry from incarceration.

Education, Employment & Training (EET) Division



- **Programs:** Comprised of 13 programs
- **Number of Staff:** 40 funded full-time positions (Employ 350 youth participants)
- **Counties Served:** Bernalillo, Sandoval, Valencia, & Tarrant
- **Services:** Services range from alternative education, workforce development, mentoring, violence prevention and intervention, Youth Build and reentry services.
- **Age range:** 8 years with our mentoring programs to adults in our alternative education and reentry programs

Education, Employment & Training (EET) Division



- **Adult Basic Education (ABE)** – age 16+ - integrated education and workforce development program to prepare for the High School Equivalency Credential and gain employment
- **HOPE Mentoring** – ages 8 to 16 – provides group mentoring services matching children & youth to adult mentors and facilitates group activities to increase social and life skills.
- **Young Minds Mentoring Initiative** – ages 16 to 18 – provides individual career-based mentoring to youth in work experiences to increase career skills and develop a career pathway.

Education, Employment & Training (EET) Division



- **WIOA (Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act)** – ages 14 to 24 – comprehensive workforce development services to gain workplace and occupational skills for career pathways.
- **Petroglyph Summer Program** – ages 16+ - provides paid work experience to youth during the summer to beautify the Petroglyph National Monument.
- **Fresh Start Rental Assistance Program** – provides up to \$10,000 OR 6 months of rental assistance to homeless individuals that also have an opioid addiction. Individual must be active in treatment.
- **Job Mentorship** – fiscal pass-through program with the City of Albuquerque providing payment to APS High School students for work experience.

Education, Employment & Training (EET) Division



- **CHANCES** – age 18+ - provides pre-release and post-release services to adults exiting from state prison or local/county jail to achieve a successful transition and reduce recidivism. The goal is to provide employability and occupational skills training for entry into long-term employment.
- **Project EVO (Equality, Vision, Opportunity)** – ages 17 to 26 – assists with post-release services for youth & young adults that are exiting incarceration or who have exited in the last two years, or foster youth transitioning out of the system. Services include exit planning, case coordination, behavioral health, housing stability, high school equivalency prep, and workforce training.
- **ABQ Against Violence** – ages 12 to 26 – provides a therapeutic approach for youth and young adults with repeated incidents of violence or crime, specifically gun violence to address traumas and decrease engagement. Services include cognitive behavioral therapy, trauma recovery and case management.

Education, Employment & Training (EET) Division

YouthBuild – provides high school equivalency classes and pre-apprenticeship training and certification in the construction field to youth ages 16-24. Participants will also assist in the building of apartment homes for low-income individuals.

Coming Soon!

Peer Support Services – provides peer recovery engagement services to individuals 18+ who are accessing the City's homeless shelters and have substance use disorders. Program will include a range of services that will lead to sustained recovery and transition to permanent housing.

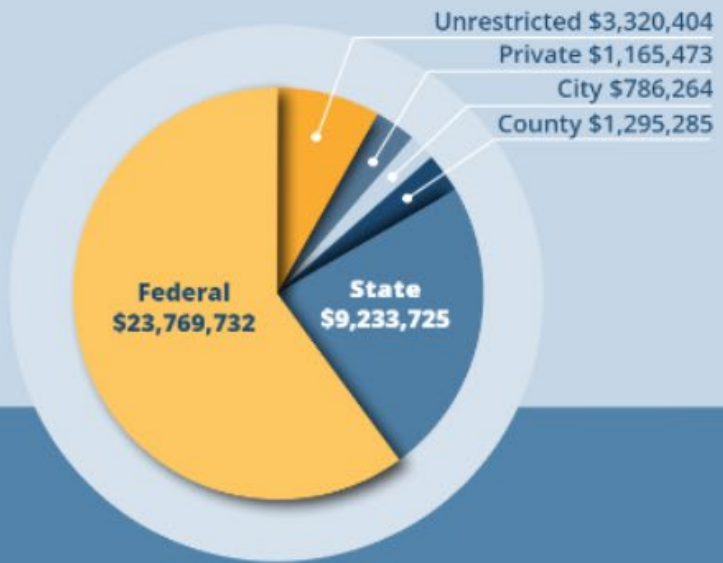
