Proposed Work Plan

The Radioactive and Hazardous Materials Committee was created in 1979 pursuant to the provisions of the Radioactive and Hazardous Materials Act. During the 2023 interim, pursuant to Section 74-4A-11 NMSA 1978, the committee will review, as scheduling permits:

- A. chromium plume cleanup and other environmental management issues;
- B. a report from the Defense Nuclear Facilities Safety Board;
- C. plutonium pit production and other Los Alamos National Laboratory projects;
- D. weapons-grade plutonium transport;
- E. issues concerning downwinders;
- F. a report from the State Emergency Response Commission;
- G. policy issues in nuclear medicine;
- H. White Sands Test Facility cleanup;
- I. a proposed green amendment to the Constitution of New Mexico;
- J. nitrogen and hydrogen energy production;
- K. a report from the Carlsbad Brine Well Remediation Authority;
- L. per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances contamination, rulemaking and litigation;

- M. produced water and water reuse;
- N. interim storage of nuclear materials;
- O. San Juan Generating Station cleanup;
- P. uranium mine and mill site reclamation;
- Q. abandoned contaminated sites, including dry cleaners;
- R. proposed changes to federal mining laws; and
- S. Kirtland Air Force Base fuel leak cleanup.
