Homeless Services



FY23 Investment: \$54 Million

- \$26M Supportive Housing = 1,365 households supported with rental assistance & case management
- \$9M Emergency Shelter = 8 shelters serving 4,800 people
- Family Housing Navigation Center: 1065 housed since Dec. 2020 (inc. 615 children)
- Collaborative Case Consultation
- Landlord Engagement Program
- Gateway Center
- Improving Coordinated Entry System

Affordable Housing



FY23 Investment: \$27 Million

- Hotel Conversion adding 90-100 affordable efficiency apartments in 9 months
- City owned/ subsidized portfolio of 633 affordable units
- Deposit and fee assistance for Section 8 vouchers
- Creating a plan to develop 5,000 units in 5 years

Behavioral Health



FY23 Investment: \$9 Million

- Substance Use Treatment services for 550 youth and adults
- Intensive Case Management for 310 people with serious mental illness, co-occurring disorders, or substance use with high unitization of emergency services
- Services for 1050 survivors of Domestic Violence and 1,800 survivors of Sexual Assault
- Strategic Planning with Bernalillo County and UNM Hospitals on impactful investments
- Suicide Prevention Training throughout the community
