MISSION

The mission of the Board is to regulate the practice of barbering and cosmetology in a manner that ensures public safety by:

- Ensuring appropriate licensure requirements for individual practitioners and establishments
- Qualifying applicants for licensure and recommending candidates to sit for the national exam (confirming competency)
- Establishing and enforcing the laws and regulations that govern the practice of barbering and cosmetology
- Requiring any person providing the regulated services be licensed in the state of New Mexico
- Requiring any establishment where the regulated services are being provided to be licensed in the state of New Mexico and adhere to inspection criteria as outlined in the rules and laws
- Providing effective means for resolving consumer complaints

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Barbers and Cosmetologists Act [Chapter 61, Article 17A NMSA 1978] is to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public by providing laws and regulations that govern licensed professionals and licensed establishments who are providing barbering and cosmetologists services within the state of New Mexico.
