What is a Behavioral Health Court?

A Behavioral Health Court is a voluntary program for adult individuals who have been arrested or convicted of a crime, have a primary behavioral health diagnosis, and have a moderate to high criminogenic risk level.

Individual's needs are matched and they are provided with a clinically appropriate level of care and support.


Goal

To support participants successful reintegration into society and reduce recidivism; increase public safety; and, improve the individual's quality of life

Eligibility Criteria

Adult individuals who have:

- Been arrested or convicted of a crime due to behavior that is a result of mental illness;
- Diagnosed Behavioral Health Disorder
- High Risk / High Need based on an objective risk need screening tool that identifies level of criminogenic risk and level of needs (housing, treatment, access to medical care, education, employment etc.)



How Does Someone Enter the Program?



Sally is 32 years old, lives with her mother, and is unemployed. She graduated high school and has some college education. Sally has a history of behavioral health disorders and law enforcement contact. Sally is competent but her behavioral health is unmanaged.

Sally was arrested for a domestic violence charge involving her mother. Sally continues to live with her mother.

Referral Process



Final Judgement & Sentence is Completed

Program Structure

- → Typically 1 year in length
- → 5 Phases
 - Phase 1: Stabilization, Orientation,& Treatment planning
 - Phase 2: Stabilization, Symptom Management, Behavioral Health & Cognitive Impairment Support
 - ◆ Phase 3: Behavior modification & Problem Solving Skills
 - ◆ Phase 4: Life Skills & Clinical Stability
 - **♦** Phase 5: Recovery Management
- → Treatment
 - **♦** Medication referral & monitoring
- → Coordinated Team Support
- → Compliance Support

Program Guidelines & Support

- ◆ Treatment attendance according to individual treatment plan
- ◆ Court attendance 1-4 times per month
- **♦** Meetings with Supervision Officer
- Medication adherence
- ◆ Random drug and alcohol testing minimum of 2 times per week
- **◆** Team Discussion & Staffing
- Connection to Resources
- Completion of mandatory minimum sentence requirements (if applicable)










Program Utilization

Behavioral Health Treatment Program

- Criminal Justice Involved
- Voluntary
- Drug & Alcohol Testing in combination with Medication Management
- Frequent Re-Assessment
- Referrals to Resources
- Supportive Structure, not punitive

- Frequent Meetings with Supervision
- Behaviors are responded individually with incentives, sanctions and service adjustments
- Team centered approach, molded by 30 years of best practices research
