

A Court Appointed Special Advocate is a person appointed as a CASA, pursuant to the provisions of the Children's Court Rules, who assists the court in determining the child's best interests by investigating the case and submitting a report to the court." §32A-1-4(E).

Children's Court Rule 10-164 governs the appointment, qualifications, powers, duties, reports, and procedures for CASAs. The CASA has an official role in judicial proceedings, working alongside professionals within the scope of Rule 10-164.


