





# **Programs Aimed to Reduce Poverty and Help Children and Families**

Program	Eligibility	Target Population	Purpose
Income Supports	TANF – 85% FPL SNAP – 135% FPL	Low-income families	Provide support for families in need
ECECD Home Visiting	Universal access	Expecting families and families with young children	Help with parenting
Child Care Assistance	400% FPL	Low-income families	Provide childcare to families



#### Recurring Early Childhood Funding History (in millions)






■ Child Care Assistance ■ Home Visiting FIT ■ Prekindergarten


### **Funding**

State and federal funding increased significantly since FY19 in part due to the Covid-19 Pandemic

 The state has an extremely broad benefits package




#### Increase in Enrollment and Funding for Home Visiting, FY17 to FY22




# New Mexico Childcare Assistance Income Eligibility

(Federal Poverty Level Percent)







### **Overall Uptake**

- Defined as how many eligible individuals are participating in a program
- Relatively low across the board, with the exception of Child Care Assistance

#### Prevalence of Income Support Enrollment Barriers in New Mexico






# **Uptake**

Most eligible children remain unserved, with only 6 percent of children under age 5 receiving services in FY22

### Home Visiting

#### Eligible and Actual Under Age 5 Home Visiting Population





### **Uptake**

- 13 thousand total slots exist for approximately 42 thousand children under 2 years
- In FY25, the legislature appropriated \$43 million to expand infant and toddler slots

#### Childcare Assistance

- According to an ECECD survey, 49 percent of families could not access child care when they needed it
- According to an ECECD survey, among others, families reported difficulties finding child care that met their needs, mainly due to challenges related to non-traditional work hours, transportation, children's behavioral health needs, or lack of care in their area



### **Overall Impact**


- Not getting what we expect from programs because of implementation
- Despite a generous benefits package, New Mexico continues to have persistently high poverty
- For home visiting, models are not being run to fidelity
- Child care assistance is serving more families than ever before, but not the families with the lowest income

# **Impact**

- New Mexico is not getting the impact we expect from these programs
- HCA reinstated the Cash Assistance Transition Bonus Program for TANF recipients



- While one model has high completion rates, most do not





#### Families Completing Home Visiting by Model





### **Impact**

- Child care assistance does not improve child welfare or education
- However, it does improve income and workforce participation, as well as childhood vaccination rates

#### Child Care Assistance


The Number of Childcare Slots have Recovered Since FY21, Except for Infant Enrollment Capacity

#### Conclusion

New Mexico significantly increased funding for child and family support programs. However, implementation is a barrier, potentially leading to low uptake and a reduction of impact for recipients.
