New Mexico APCD: Overview

- What's in an APCD?
 - Systemically collects medical, pharmacy, and dental claims, eligibility files, and provider files (physician and facility) into a database
 - Fills critical information gaps about healthcare cost and usage and identifies trends
 - Promotes healthcare transparency initiatives for healthcare policy and government leadership
 - Provides relevant and useful information for diverse stakeholders' interest
- What's **NOT** in an APCD?
 - Federal Programs: Veterans Health Administration (VHA), TRICARE, and Indian Health Service (IHS)
 - Employer sponsored plans regulated under the federal Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA)
 - Uninsured, Self-Pay, Charity, and Workers' Compensation claims.

New Mexico APCD Overview:



Providers

- Quality and utilization of provider and peer group care
- Identifies and monitors quality improvement projects

Payers

- Comparative performance of provider networks to statewide benchmarks
- Identify variation in utilization and cost efficiency

Employers

- Increased transparency in the cost and utilization of health care to stabilize the cost of health coverage for employers
- Larger population/sample size and benchmarks

Public

- Cost “shopping” websites to find lowest cost for procedures and services, etc.

Policy Makers

- Inform/support public policy with information on how the health care system is operating to support data-driven improvements in access, quality, and cost of healthcare

Public Health Practitioners

- Variation in utilization of health care services to target “hot spot” opportunities to improve population health
- Cost burden of chronic diseases such as diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and asthma
- Evaluate public health programs

2024 HIS Act amendment, [24-14A-6](#), provides the NM Health Care Authority (HCA) direct, secure access to NM APCD data, effective July 1, 2024.

New Mexico APCD: Funding



- State Funding:
C2 funding in SFY 2019 through SFY 2025
- Federal Funding (CMS Medicaid) Match:
90 % Federal/10% State Match for Design, Development, Implementation (DDI) Phase
- Ongoing Funding:
Up to 75% Federal Funding with required State match for Maintenance and Operations

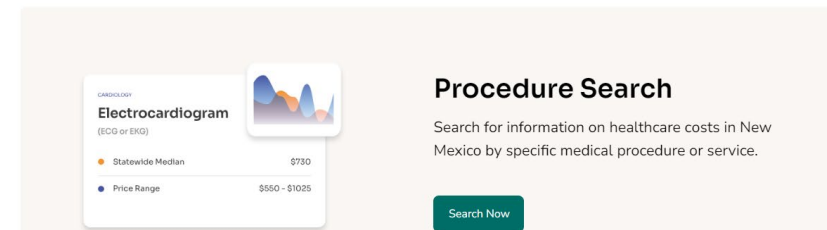
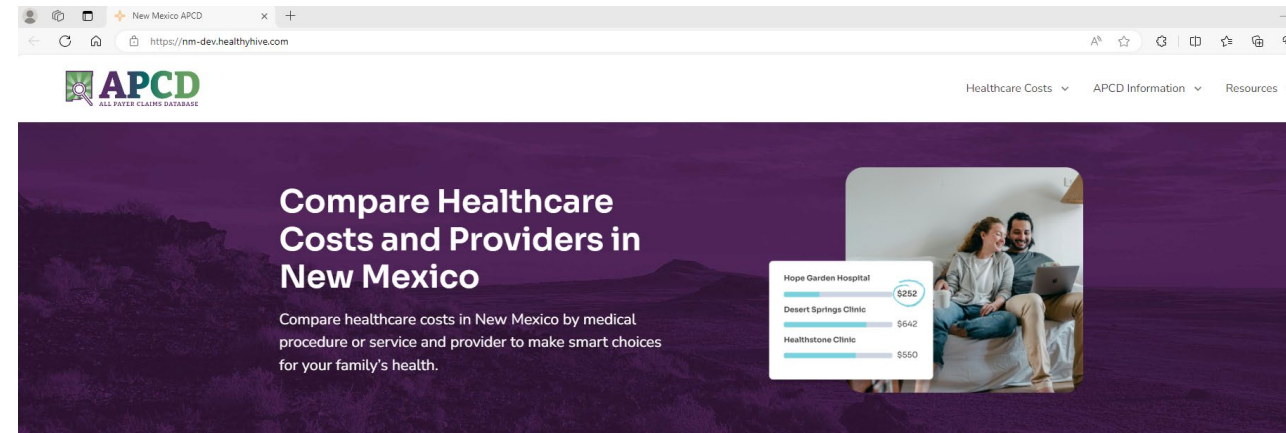
What's currently in the NM APCD?

- 160 Million Claims (January 2020 - March 2024)
- 21 Commercial Payers + Medicare Advantage (January 2020 - March 2024)
 - Medicaid
 - Medicare
- 1.46 Million Lives Covered (2023, Medical)
 - 29% are covered by Commercial plans
 - 68% are covered by Medicaid
 - 3% are covered by Medicare Advantage plans
 - Total and percentages will be updated to include Medicare in FY25
- Annual Trend information 2020-2023
- Full Database vs Public Portal

New Mexico APCD: Next Steps

- Continue to work with data submitters and monitor for additional data submitters (new insurers)
- Incorporate Medicare claims data into APCD
- Work with voluntary data submitters, e.g. NM Medical Insurance Pool
- Finalize APCD Data Release Subcommittee and fulfill approved data requests
- Expand APCD reporting to include Total Cost of Care
- Update Public Portal with final updates for soft launch in September
- Expand Public Portal with Spanish language translation
- Continue with stakeholder engagement stakeholders & host Summit
