

The Safe System approach aims to eliminate fatal and serious injuries for all road users by:




Accommodating human mistakes


#### NATIONAL ROADWAY SAFETY STRATEGY

- Leverages new funding and policies in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to bring this strategy to life.



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

#### SAFE SPEEDS: REDUCING PEDESTRIAN FATALITIES

Hit by a vehicle traveling at

23

**MPH** 

10% risk of death



Hit by a vehicle traveling at

42

**MPH** 

50% risk of death



Hit by a vehicle traveling at

58

**MPH** 

90% risk of death



#### WHERE ARE YOU ON THE SAFE SYSTEM JOURNEY?

Traditional approach Safe System approach

Prevent crashes — Prevent death and serious injuries

Improve human behavior ——— Design for human mistakes/limitations

Control speeding Reduce system kinetic energy

Individuals are responsible 

Share responsibility

React based on crash history — Proactively identify and address risks
