Three members from public post-secondary educational institutions;


Four members from the private sector, including the national laboratories, museums and science- and engineering-based businesses; and

 - Family & Community Engagement







2023 Critical Issues for Math

- Provide funding for an Elementary Math Specialist Endorsement stipend
- Provide teachers with high quality professional development to support student and teacher Math identity
- High school mathematics pathway stays within the rigor of CCSS-M and beyond
