Senate Committee Zoom Instructions

1. Finding Your Zoom Link

- a. To find the appropriate Zoom link go to https://www.nmlegis.gov/ .
- b. Click "Committees" and select the committee you want to watch.
- c. Select "Click here to join the Zoom meeting for S****". This will bring you to Zoom's launch screen.

2. Accessing Zoom Meetings

- a. When you click on a Committee's Zoom link. It will take you to Zoom's launch site.
- b. Select "Open Zoom Meetings". This will launch Zoom on your computer if you have it installed.
 - NOTE: If you are not signed into Zoom you will not be able to access the webinar. As such, you must either sign into your Zoom account or create a new account (if you do not have one).
- c. Log in to your Zoom account.
 - NOTE: You do not need to have a paid Zoom account. You can access Senate Zoom meetings with both a Licensed account and a Free account.

3. Creating a Zoom account (If you do not have one)

- a. If you do not have a Zoom account, follow this link to sign up for one; https://www.zoom.us/signup#/signup
- b. You will need to confirm your <u>birth year</u> and enter the <u>email</u> that you want connected to the account.
- c. A verification code will be sent to your email.
- d. Enter the code in the spaces provided.
- e. A new page will appear requesting your first/last name and the password for your Zoom account.
- f. Select "Continue" to log into your new account.
- g. Follow the instructions above for Accessing Zoom Meetings, to join the meeting of your choice.

4. Troubleshooting

- a. "Host requires authentication on the commercial Zoom ... "
 - In this case, the Zoom webinar simply needs the user to log into a Zoom account
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b. "I Can't Participate in the Zoom Committee Meeting" (Public Comment)

- Many Senate Committees operate differently. Some take public speakers when the bill goes to public comment within committee, while others require the user to sign up 24 hours in advance.
