

Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee 2022 Interim Summary

The Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee held four meetings in 2022. In Gallup and Taos, the locations the subcommittee traveled to during the interim, the subcommittee heard updates on transportation infrastructure needs in those areas. The subcommittee also heard presentations throughout the interim on broadband expansion; electric vehicle infrastructure needs; the implementation of the Wildlife Corridors Act; and several presentations related to rail, including an update on the New Mexico Rail Runner Express and a proposed Four Corners rail project. After the August and September meeting held in Taos, members traveled to Questa for the dedication of the Senator Carlos R. Cisneros Memorial Highway.

The Department of Transportation also provided several comprehensive reports of its work, including in-depth reports on letting projects by district and a detailed presentation on the taxes and fees that provide revenue for transportation infrastructure in New Mexico, how the revenue is distributed and how the rates of taxes and fees compare with those of other states.

Approved Work Plan

The New Mexico Legislative Council created the Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee on April 26, 2022 to develop recommendations to meet the needs of New Mexico's businesses and residents for transportation and infrastructure and to identify current and new sources of revenue.

During the 2022 interim, the Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee will review and discuss the following topics, as time permits:

- 1. financing and future investment needs for New Mexico transportation and infrastructure;
- 2. the interstate highway system in New Mexico;
- 3. Department of Transportation construction, maintenance and paving schedules, environmental concerns and public safety and a user guide to the Department of Transportation website;
- 4. autonomous vehicles;
- 5. interstate trucking and frontage road development;
- 6. the use and expansion of rail services;

- 7. roads and highways on Native American land, including school bus routes and use by commercial vehicles;
- 8. intermodal facilities and ports of entry;
- 9. highway conditions and safety;
- 10. transportation issues relevant to the oil and gas industry and other related industries;
- 11. transportation issues relevant to the agriculture industry;
- 12. rural transit and paratransit systems and opportunities to improve services and share resources with state and federal entities;
- 13. metropolitan area highway conditions and transportation plans;
- 14. public-private partnerships to improve infrastructure;
- 15. bus systems and public transportation, including zero-fare programs;
- 16. bike and pedestrian trails and infrastructure improvements, safety needs and local solutions, including bicycle mechanic programs and disability accommodation;
- 17. electrification plans in New Mexico for personal vehicles and public transportation;
- 18. intelligent transportation systems;
- 19. new fuel technology, including hydrogen and other fuels;
- 20. broadband expansion, accessibility and rights of way;
- 21. clean fuel standards;
- 22. the gasoline tax and vehicle excise tax;
- 23. disability mobility and access to transportation;
- 24. heat islands and water infrastructure and green stormwater management;
- 25. wildlife crossings and corridors;
- 26. urban sprawl and high-density workforce housing;
- 27. the use of drones and possible regulation of drone technology;

- 28. the proposed national infrastructure bank;
- 29. an accounting of the available electricity;
- 30. road user fees;
- 31. regional transportation systems;
- 32. aviation and airports;
- 33. electric vehicle charging stations; and
- 34. an update on House Joint Resolution 1 (2022), the proposed constitutional amendment to allow public investment to provide access to essential household services, including internet, energy, water, wastewater and other similar services.

Representative Garratt welcomed everyone and invited members of the subcommittee and staff to introduce themselves.

Transportation Electrification Infrastructure Update (10:17 a.m.)

Jerry P. Valdez, executive director, Executive Projects Office, Department of Transportation (DOT), provided an overview of the DOT's state and federal funding sources, including the federal National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Formula Program, for electric vehicle infrastructure and the state's strategy for installing charging stations throughout the state. Mary Jane Parks, solar energy innovator fellow, Public Regulation Commission, summarized the commission's recent work on preparing the state for transportation electrification. Alaric Babej, manager, Customer Program Marketing and Development, Public Service Company of New Mexico, explained the types of electric vehicles and charging stations as well as the expected growth of electric vehicles. Mark Faulkenberry, vice president, Marketing and Member Relations, Western Farmers Electric Cooperative, predicted that the future of mobility will be with electric vehicles and explained how electric cooperatives can prepare for the increased demands that charging electric vehicles will have on their systems. Vince Martinez, senior government relations advisor - New Mexico, Tri-State Generation and Transmission Association (Tri-State), discussed Tri-State's efforts to educate the public about electric vehicles and its incentive programs for both residential and commercial customers.
