Section 3. APPROPRIATION.--One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the economic development department for expenditure in fiscal year 2001 for the purpose of establishing and operating the rural affairs bureau in the economic development division of the economic development department. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2001 shall revert to the general fund.

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
