AN ACT

RELATING TO CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES; PROVIDING FOR AN ADULT
MALE IN-PRISON SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FACILITY AND AN
ADULT FEMALE REINTEGRATION FACILITY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES--APPROPRIATIONS--
CONDITIONS.--

A. One million six hundred fifty thousand dollars
(\$1,650,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the
corrections department as the state match with fourteen
million eight hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$14,850,000)
from the federal violent offender incarceration grants fund
for expenditure in fiscal year 2001 for the purpose of
acquiring a four-hundred bed adult male in-prison substance
abuse treatment facility located in the middle Rio Grande
corridor. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance of the

1 general fund appropriation remaining at the end of fiscal
2 year 2001 shall revert to the general fund.

3 B. Three million dollars (\$3,000,000) is
4 appropriated from the general fund to the corrections
5 department for expenditure in fiscal year 2001 for the
6 purpose of acquiring a two-hundred-fifty bed adult female
7 reintegration facility adjacent to the facility to be
8 acquired pursuant to Subsection A of this section. Any
9 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
10 fiscal year 2001 shall revert to the general fund.

11 C. No contract for the acquisition of a facility
12 shall be entered into pursuant to Subsection A or B of this
13 section unless the secretary of corrections certifies that
14 the facility will be built by a primary contractor and
15 subcontractors that:

- 16 (1) maintain their primary places of
17 business in New Mexico;
- 18 (2) hire laborers for construction of the
19 facility as employees, rather than as independent
20 contractors, and who are New Mexico residents;
- 21 (3) provide health care benefits, retirement
22 benefits and unemployment insurance to their employees
23 working on construction of the facility; and
- 24 (4) maintain apprenticeship programs for
25 their employees.
