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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
10	Section 1. Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996,
18	Chapter 71, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"21-1-4.3. TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS AUTHORIZEDCERTAIN
20	EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS
21	A. To the extent that funds are made available by
22	the legislature from the lottery tuition fund and subject to
23	the limitations provided in this section, the boards of
24	regents of New Mexico state university, New Mexico institute
25	of mining and technology, eastern New Mexico university,
	western New Mexico university, the university of New Mexico,
	New Mexico highlands university and northern New Mexico state
	school shall award tuition scholarships for qualified
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resident students attending their respective institutions and 2 branches of those institutions.

3 [B. Except as authorized in Subsection C of this 4 section, the tuition scholarships authorized in this section 5 shall apply only to full-time resident students who, 6 immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a 7 public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon 8 receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, are accepted for 9 entrance to and attend one of the state educational 10 institutions set forth in this section or one of the branches 11 of those institutions. Each tuition scholarship shall be 12 awarded for up to four consecutive years beginning the second 13 semester of the recipient's first year of enrollment, 14 provided that the recipient has maintained residency in New 15 Mexico and maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or higher 16 on a 4.0 scale during his first semester of full-time 17 enrollment.

C. The tuition scholarships authorized in this section shall also apply to full-time resident students who, immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, attend a two-year public post-secondary educational institution in New Mexico and who, upon the completion of that curriculum or at the end of two years, whichever is sooner, transfer to one of the post-secondary state educational institutions set forth in this section. Those students shall be eligible for a tuition

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1 scholarship for two consecutive years, provided that those 2 students maintain residency in New Mexico, maintain a grade 3 point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale and attend the 4 institution full time during the regular academic year. 5 The tuition scholarships authorized in this <del>D.</del> 6 section shall also apply to full-time resident students who: 7 (1) within one hundred twenty days of 8 completion of a high school curriculum at a public or 9 accredited private New Mexico high school, or of receiving a 10 graduate equivalent diploma, begin service in the United 11 States armed forces; and 12 (2) within one hundred twenty days of 13 completion of honorable service or medical discharge from the 14 service are accepted for entrance to and attend one of the 15 state educational institutions set forth in this section. 16 B. A tuition scholarship award shall be equal to 17 forty percent of the cost of tuition and fees per semester at 18 any of the four-year educational institutions set forth in 19 Subsection A of this section and sixty-five percent of the 20 cost of tuition and fees per semester at any of the two-year 21 educational institutions set forth in that subsection. 22 C. A tuition scholarship is available to a New 23 Mexico resident student who meets the following eligibility 24 requirements: 25 (1) the annual income of the student's family is seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) or less, as

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defined by the commission on higher education;

(2) the student:
(a) is accepted for entrance to and
attends one of the state educational institutions set forth
in Subsection A of this section immediately upon completion
of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private
<u>New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate</u>
<u>equivalent diploma;</u>
(b) is accepted for entrance to and
attends one of the four-year educational institutions set
forth in Subsection A of this section upon completion of a
high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New
<u>Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent</u>
<u>diploma and upon attendance at a two-year public post-</u>
secondary educational institution in New Mexico that resulted
in the completion of the two-year curriculum or transfer at
the end of two years, whichever is sooner, to one of the
four-year educational institutions; or
(c) within one hundred twenty days of
completion of a high school curriculum at a public or
accredited private New Mexico high school, or of receiving a
graduate equivalent diploma, begins service in the United
States armed forces and within one hundred twenty days of
completion of honorable service or medical discharge from the
United States armed forces is accepted for entrance to and
attends one of the state educational institutions set forth
in Subsection A of this section;
(3) the student maintains residency in New

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1 <u>Mexico; and</u>

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2 (4) the student maintained a grade point
3 average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during his first
4 semester to qualify for the initial tuition scholarship and
5 he continues to maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or
6 higher on a 4.0 scale during succeeding semesters to continue
7 to receive the award.

D. A tuition scholarship shall be awarded for tuition and fees for a maximum of sixty credit hours within four consecutive years. A New Mexico resident student may receive a tuition scholarship for part-time or full-time attendance at an educational institution set forth in Subsection A of this section.

E. The commission on higher education shall prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student <u>initial and</u> continuing eligibility criteria and guidelines for administration of the tuition scholarship program. Guidelines shall be distributed to the board of regents of each institution to enable a uniform availability of the resident student tuition scholarships."

Section 2. Section 21-13-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963, Chapter 17, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read:

"21-13-10. BOARD DUTIES.--

A. It [shall be] is the duty of the community college board to determine financial and educational policies of the community college. The community college board shall provide for the management of the community college and

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B. The community college board shall have the power to fix tuition and fee rates for resident and nonresident students of the district, to accept gifts, to accept federal aid, to purchase, hold, sell and rent property and equipment and to promote the general welfare of the institution for the best interest of educational service to the people of the community college district.

C. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the community college board shall award tuition scholarships for qualified resident students attending [their respective institutions] the community college. A tuition scholarship shall be equal to sixty-five percent of the cost of tuition and fees per semester at the community college.

D. [The] <u>A</u> tuition [scholarships] scholarship authorized in this section shall apply [only] to <u>a part-time</u> or full-time resident [students] student who, immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, [are] <u>is</u> accepted for entrance to and [attend] attends a community college. [Each] <u>A</u>

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1 tuition scholarship shall be awarded for up to two 2 consecutive years beginning the second semester of the 3 [recipient's] student's first year of enrollment [provided 4 that the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and 5 maintained a grade-point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 6 scale during his first semester of full-time enrollment] if 7 the student meets the following eligibility requirements: 8 (1) the annual income of the student's 9 family is seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) or less, as 10 defined by the commission on higher education; 11 (2) the student maintains residency in New 12 Mexico; and 13 (3) the student maintained a grade point 14 average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during his first 15 semester to qualify for the tuition scholarship and he 16 continues to maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or higher 17 on a 4.0 scale during succeeding semesters to continue to 18 receive the award. 19 The commission on higher education shall Ε. 20 prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student initial and 21 continuing eligibility criteria and guidelines for 22 administration of the tuition scholarship program. 23 Guidelines shall be distributed to community college boards 24 to enable a uniform availability of the resident student 25 tuition scholarship." Section 3. Section 21-16-10.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws

1996, Chapter 71, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:

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"21-16-10.1. TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS AUTHORIZED.--

A. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the board of a technical and vocational institute shall award tuition scholarships for qualified resident students attending a technical and vocational institute.

The tuition scholarships authorized in this Β. section shall apply [only] to a part-time or full-time resident [students] student who, immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma [are] is accepted for entrance to and [attend] attends a technical and vocational institute. [Each] <u>A</u> tuition scholarship shall be awarded for up to two consecutive years beginning the second semester of the [recipient's] student's first year of enrollment [provided that the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and maintained a grade-point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during his first semester of full-time enrollment with renewal of an additional two years upon transfer] if the student meets the following eligibility requirements: (1) the annual income of the student's family is seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) or less, as defined by the commission on higher education;

(2) the student maintains residency in New

Mexico; and

(3) the student maintained a grade point

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1	average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during his first
2	semester to qualify for the tuition scholarship and he
3	<u>continues to maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or higher</u>
4	on a 4.0 scale during succeeding semesters to continue to
5	receive the award.
6	C. The commission on higher education shall
7	prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student initial and
8	continuing eligibility criteria and guidelines for
9	administration of the tuition scholarship program.
10	Guidelines shall be distributed to the boards of technical
11	and vocational institutes to enable a uniform availability of
12	the resident student tuition scholarships."
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
