AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; REAUTHORIZING PRIOR SEVERANCE TAX BOND AUTHORIZATIONS; CHANGING GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS; CHANGING PURPOSES; EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIODS; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. CANONCITO COURTHOUSE-- EXTEND EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The period of time in which the proceeds from the sale of severance tax bonds appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection R of Section 12 of Chapter 7 of Laws 1998 for a court building for the Canoncito chapter, now officially designated as To'hajiilee, in Bernalillo county may be expended is extended through fiscal year 2007. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the

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1 severance tax bonding fund.

2 Section 2. LITTLE WATER POWER LINE--CHANGE OF LOCATION
3 AND PURPOSE CANCELLED--EXTEND EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The
4 proceeds from the sale of severance tax bonds appropriated to
5 the New Mexico office of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection
6 Q of Section 15 of Chapter 2 of Laws 1999 (1st S.S.) to plan,
7 design and construct power line extensions at Little Water
8 chapter in McKinley county and reauthorized and appropriated
9 in Section 49 of Chapter 99 of Laws 2002 to plan, design,
10 acquire rights of way, complete surveys and assessments and
11 construct domestic water system infrastructure in Whitehorse
12 Lake in McKinley county shall not be used for the changed
13 purpose but shall be used for the original purpose pursuant to
14 Subsection Q of Section 15 of Chapter 2 of Laws 1999 (1st
15 S.S.). The period of time in which the severance tax bond
16 proceeds appropriated in Section 62 of Chapter 23 of Laws 2000
17 (2nd S.S.) may be expended is extended through fiscal year
18 2007. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the
19 end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the severance tax
20 bonding fund.

21 Section 3. HUERFANO MULTIPURPOSE CENTER--EXTEND
22 EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The period of time in which the proceeds
23 from the sale of severance tax bonds appropriated to the New
24 Mexico office of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection 0 of
25 Section 16 of Chapter 148 of Laws 1994 to plan, design and

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1 construct a multipurpose center in Huerfano in San Juan county
2 and reauthorized in Paragraph (3) of Subsection B of Section
3 72 of Chapter 118 of Laws 1998 may be expended is extended
4 through fiscal year 2007. Any unexpended or unencumbered
5 balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert
6 to the severance tax bonding fund.

7 Section 4. TO' HAJIILEE SEWAGE LAGOON--CHANGE PURPOSE TO
8 DEVELOP DOMESTIC WATER SYSTEMS FOR INDIGENT FAMILIES IN THE
9 TO' HAJIILEE CHAPTER IN BERNALILLO COUNTY.--The severance tax
10 bond appropriation made in Subsection 32 of Section 20 of
11 Chapter 110 of Laws 2002 to the New Mexico office of Indian
12 affairs to plan, design and construct a sewage lagoon in the
13 To'hajiilee chapter in Bernalillo county shall not be expended
14 for that purpose but is reauthorized and appropriated to
15 develop domestic water systems for indigent families in the
16 To'hajiilee chapter in Bernalillo county.

17 Section 5. NAGEEZI CHAPTER PRESCHOOL--CHANGE PURPOSE TO
18 EXTEND A POWER LINE FOR INDIGENT FAMILIES IN THE NAGEEZI
19 CHAPTER OF THE NAVAJO NATION IN SAN JUAN COUNTY--EXTENDING THE
20 EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The severance tax bond appropriation made
21 in Subsection FF of Section 18 of Chapter 118 of Laws 1998 to
22 the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for planning,
23 designing and constructing a preschool in Nageezi in San Juan
24 county shall not be expended for the original purpose but is
25 reauthorized and appropriated to extend a power line for

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1 indigent families in the Nageezi chapter of the Navajo Nation
2 in San Juan county. The period of time in which the
3 appropriation may be expended is extended through fiscal year
4 2007. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the
5 end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the severance tax
6 bonding fund.

7 Section 6. NAVAJO AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY-- CHANGE
8 PURPOSE TO PLAN, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCT A FOUR CORNERS MONUMENT
9 PARK AND VISITORS' CENTER IN SAN JUAN COUNTY-- EXTENDING THE
10 EXPENDITURE PERIOD. --The balance of the proceeds from the sale
11 of severance tax bonds appropriated to the New Mexico office
12 of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection CC of Section 18 of
13 Chapter 118 of Laws 1998 shall not be expended for the
14 original purpose but is reauthorized and appropriated to plan,
15 design and construct a Four Corners monument park and
16 visitors' center in San Juan county. The period of time in
17 which the appropriation may be expended is extended through
18 fiscal year 2007. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance
19 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the
20 severance tax bonding fund.

21 Section 7. HOGBACK HEADSTART CLASSROOM- CHANGE PURPOSE
22 TO PLAN, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCT A FOUR CORNERS MONUMENT PARK AND
23 VISITORS' CENTER IN SAN JUAN COUNTY-- EXTENDING THE EXPENDITURE
24 PERIOD. --The balance of the proceeds from the sale of
25 severance tax bonds appropriated to the New Mexico office of

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1 Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection A of Section 16 of
2 Chapter 148 of Laws 1994 to purchase, transport, install and
3 equip a modular classroom addition for the Hogback headstart
4 building and reauthorized in Paragraph (3) of Subsection B of
5 Section 72 of Chapter 118 of Laws 1998 is reauthorized and
6 appropriated to plan, design and construct a Four Corners
7 monument park and visitors' center in San Juan county. The
8 period of time in which the appropriation may be expended is
9 extended through fiscal year 2007. Any unexpended or
10 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007
11 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

12 Section 8. BACA HEADSTART MODULAR BUILDING--CHANGE
13 PURPOSE OF GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION TO PLAN, DESIGN AND
14 CONSTRUCT A FOUR CORNERS MONUMENT PARK AND VISITORS' CENTER IN
15 SAN JUAN COUNTY--EXTENDING THE EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The
16 balance of the general fund appropriation made to the New
17 Mexico office of Indian affairs pursuant to Paragraph (8) of
18 Subsection D of Section 49 of Chapter 148 of Laws 1994 to
19 purchase, transport, install and equip a headstart modular
20 building in the community of Baca in McKinley county and
21 reauthorized in Subsection Q of Section 72 of Chapter 118 of
22 Laws 1998 shall not be expended for the original purpose but
23 is reauthorized and appropriated to plan, design and construct
24 a Four Corners monument park and visitors' center in San Juan
25 county. The period of time in which the appropriation may be

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1 expended is extended through fiscal year 2007. Any unexpended
2 or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year
3 2007 shall revert to the general fund.

4 Section 9. BACA HEADSTART MODULAR BUILDING-- CHANGE
5 PURPOSE OF GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION TO PLAN, DESIGN AND
6 CONSTRUCT A FOUR CORNERS MONUMENT PARK AND VISITORS' CENTER IN
7 SAN JUAN COUNTY-- EXTENDING THE EXPENDITURE PERIOD. --The
8 balance of the general fund appropriation made to the New
9 Mexico office of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection CC of
10 Section 28 of Chapter 222 of Laws 1995 to purchase, transport,
11 install and equip a headstart modular building in the
12 community of Baca in McKinley county and reauthorized in
13 Subsection S of Section 72 of Chapter 118 of Laws 1998 shall
14 not be expended for the original purpose but is reauthorized
15 and appropriated to plan, design and construct a Four Corners
16 monument park and visitors' center in San Juan county. The
17 period of time in which the appropriation may be expended is
18 extended through fiscal year 2007. Any unexpended or
19 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007
20 shall revert to the general fund.

21 Section 10. WHITEHORSE LAKE HEADSTART MODULAR BUILDING--
22 CHANGE PURPOSE OF GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION TO PURCHASE AND
23 INSTALL A FENCE FOR THE WHITEHORSE LAKE HEADSTART MODULAR
24 BUILDING AND ALSO TO PLAN, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCT A FOUR CORNERS
25 MONUMENT PARK AND VISITORS' CENTER IN SAN JUAN COUNTY--

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1 EXTENDING THE EXPENDITURE PERIOD. --The general fund
2 appropriation made to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs
3 pursuant to Subsection AA of Section 28 of Chapter 222 of Laws
4 1995 to purchase, transport, install and equip a headstart
5 modular building in Whitehorse Lake and reauthorized in
6 Subsection S of Section 72 of Chapter 118 of Laws 1998 shall
7 not be expended for the original purpose but is reauthorized
8 and appropriated equally to purchase and install a fence for
9 the Whitehorse Lake headstart modular building and also to
10 plan, design and construct a Four Corners monument park and
11 visitors' center in San Juan county. The period of time in
12 which the appropriation may be expended is extended through
13 fiscal year 2007. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance
14 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the
15 general fund.
