Upon a determination that the person qualifies 24 for the senior prescription drug program, the authority shall 25 collect an enrollment fee not to exceed sixty dollars (\$60.00) . 140853. 1 - 2 -

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per year. The authority shall collect the enrollment fees, and the enrollment fees shall be used by the authority to cover the cost of administering the program.

D. The amount a qualified person pays for a prescription drug shall not exceed the total cost of the dispensing fee plus the contracted discounted price made available to the authority.

8 E. The authority shall provide general information
9 to the public about the availability of the senior
10 prescription drug program.

The "senior prescription drug program fund" is F. created in the state treasury. All fees collected pursuant to Subsection C of this section shall be deposited in the fund and shall be used by the authority to administer the senior prescription drug program. Money appropriated to the fund or accruing to it through gifts, grants, fees or bequests shall be deposited in the fund. Earnings from investment of the fund shall be credited to the general fund. Money in the fund shall not revert at the end of any fiscal year. **Disbursements** from the fund shall be made upon warrants drawn by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the director of the authority or his authorized representative. The authority shall annually adjust the enrollment fee to permit necessary administration of the program but shall not exceed the amount established in
