Section 1. Secti on 22-2-8. 4 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1986, Chapter 33, Secti on 5, as amended by Laws 2001, Chapter 257, Section 1 and by Laws 2001, Chapter 276, Section 1) is amended to read:
" 22-2-8. 4. GRADUATI ON REQUI REMENTS. - -
A. At the end of the ei ghth grade or during the ni nth grade, each student shall prepare an i ndi vidual program of st udy for grades ni ne through twel ve. The program of st udy shall be si gned by a student's parent or guardian.
B. Begi nni ng with students entering the ni nth
grade in the 1986-87 school year, successful completion of a mi ni mum of twenty-three units shall be required for graduation. These units shall be as follows:
(1) four units in English, wi th maj or emphasis on grammar and liter at ure;
(2) three units in mat hematics;
(3) t wo units in science, one of whi ch shal I have a I aborat ory component;
(4) [three] four units in social science, whi ch shall include United St ates hi story and geography; world hi story and geography; New Mexico state history, with an emphasis on the history of I and grants and Native Americans; and gover nment and economi cs;
(5) one unit in physical [fitness] education;
(6) one unit in comminication skills, with maj or emphasis on writing and speaking, whi ch may incl ude a I anguage ot her than English; and
(7) [nine] ei ght el ective units. Onl y the following el ective units shall be counted toward meeting the requi rements for graduation: fine arts, i.e., music, band, chorus and art; practical arts; physical education; I anguages ot her than English; speech; drama; vocational education; mathemat i cs; sci ence; Engl ish; [R.O.T.C.] reserve officers' training corps; soci al sci ence; computer sci ence; heal th education; American sign I anguage; and ot her el ectives . 140124. 1

Wth the approval of the local school board,
 during the school day may count toward fulfillment of the physical education requi red unit.
C. Final exami nations shall be admi ni stered to all students in all classes offered for credit.
D. No student shall receive a hi gh school di pl oma who has not passed a state graduation exam nation in the subj ect areas of reading, English, math, writing, sci ence and soci al science. Begi nni ng with the 1996-97 school year, the state graduati on exami nations on soci al sci ence shall incl ude a section on the constitution of the United States and the constitution of New Mexico. If a student exits fromthe school system at the end of grade twel ve without having passed a state graduation exami nation, he shall recei ve an appropriate state certificate indicating the number of credits earned and the grade compl eted. If within five years after a student exits fromthe school system he takes and passes the state graduation examination, he may recei ve a hi gh school di ploma.
E. The state board may establish a policy to provi de for administrative inter pretations to clarify curricular and testing provisions of the Public School Code. "
