AN ACT

RELATING TO TOBACCO SETTLEMENT REVENUE; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS
FROM THE TOBACCO SETTLEMENT PROGRAM FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATIONS. --

A. The following amounts are appropriated from the tobacco settlement program fund to the following agencies for the specified purposes for expenditure in fiscal year 2003:

(1) eight million dollars (\$8,000,000) to the department of health for comprehensive tobacco use prevention and cessation programs that are community based, culturally appropriate and designed to achieve the "best practices" standards developed by the federal centers for disease control and prevention;

(2) two hundred seventy-five thousand dollars

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1 (\$275,000) to the department of health to contract for media
2 literacy tobacco use prevention intervention programs for
3 school-age children;

4 (3) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to the
5 department of health for diabetes prevention;

6 (4) two million five hundred thousand dollars
7 (\$2,500,000) to the department of health to contract for a
8 program of primary prevention home visits to families of
9 newborns, from the prenatal stage to age three, with priority
10 to be given to at-risk families;

11 (5) four hundred seventy thousand dollars
12 (\$470,000) to the department of health for human
13 immunodeficiency virus and acquired immune deficiency syndrome
14 prevention;

15 (6) one million six hundred thousand dollars
16 (\$1,600,000) to the department of health to expand operating
17 support of primary care clinics;

18 (7) five million eight hundred thirty
19 thousand dollars (\$5,830,000) to the board of regents of the
20 university of New Mexico for the health sciences center to be
21 distributed as follows:

22 (a) three million eight hundred eighty
23 thousand dollars (\$3,880,000) for tobacco-related research and
24 core support of the masters in public health program;

25 (b) four hundred thousand dollars

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1 (\$400,000) for education in pediatrics;
2 (c) four hundred thousand dollars
3 (\$400,000) for specialty education in trauma;
4 (d) fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000)
5 for an area health education center;
6 (e) fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000)
7 for Los Pasos program;
8 (f) fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000)
9 for the Para Los Ninos program;
10 (g) four hundred thousand dollars
11 (\$400,000) for pediatric oncology;
12 (h) four hundred fifty thousand dollars
13 (\$450,000) for the poison and drug information center; and
14 (i) one hundred fifty thousand dollars
15 (\$150,000) for the telemedicine project;
16 (8) one million seven hundred fifty thousand
17 dollars (\$1,750,000) to the board of regents of the university
18 of New Mexico for the health sciences center to contract for
19 research on emphysema and lung cancer detection and treatment;
20 and
21 (9) six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000)
22 to the New Mexico veterans' service commission to contract for
23 an assisted living program for veterans with lung disease.

24 B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balances
25 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2003 shall revert to the

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1 tobacco settlement program fund.

2 Section 2. SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS. --

3 A. The following amounts are appropriated from the
4 balances of the tobacco settlement program fund to the
5 following agencies for the specified purposes for expenditure
6 in fiscal year 2003:

7 (1) thirty-two thousand five hundred dollars
8 (\$32,500) to the second judicial district court to contract
9 for a women's re-entry drug treatment court pilot project;

10 (2) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000)
11 to the board of regents of the university of New Mexico for
12 the health sciences center to contract for a retest of women
13 who participated in studies on early detection of lung cancer;

14 (3) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
15 to the department of health to provide defibrillators in state
16 buildings and to contract for associated training costs;

17 (4) one hundred fifty thousand dollars
18 (\$150,000) to the department of health to create a center for
19 nursing excellence to develop strategies to address the
20 nursing shortage;

21 (5) four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000)
22 to the department of health to contract for statewide
23 workshops and conferences for medical professionals and
24 community laypersons to provide education about acute stroke
25 treatment, risk factors and programs;

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1 (6) one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000)
2 to the department of health to contract for a needs assessment
3 for a comprehensive cancer control plan;

4 (7) six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000)
5 to the department of health to contract for the linking of
6 information among the state's community access programs;

7 (8) one hundred fifty thousand dollars
8 (\$150,000) to the department of health to contract for a
9 diabetic retinal screening program;

10 (9) six hundred three thousand six hundred
11 dollars (\$603,600) to the department of health to contract for
12 a pilot addictions treatment program to integrate a tobacco
13 use cessation component into three existing DWI, alcohol and
14 other drug treatment programs and to contract for a linkage of
15 alcohol, tobacco and other drug prevention and treatment
16 activities among the counties;

17 (10) one million eight hundred thousand
18 dollars (\$1,800,000) to the department of health to contract
19 for an information and medical records system infrastructure
20 for primary care clinics;

21 (11) one million eight hundred ten thousand
22 three hundred dollars (\$1,810,300) to the department of health
23 to contract for seed money for a youth smoking cessation and
24 prevention program in youth organizations statewide;

25 (12) three million five hundred thousand

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1 dollars (\$3,500,000) to the department of health to provide
2 school-based mental health expansion and maintenance of
3 statewide substance abuse prevention; and

4 (13) two hundred fifty thousand dollars
5 (\$250,000) to the department of health to contract for women's
6 inpatient treatment beds as an alternative to prison.

7 B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balances
8 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2003 shall revert to the
9 tobacco settlement program fund.

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
