AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES; INCREASING THE MINIMUM SALARY

FOR STATE EMPLOYEES AND CERTAIN STATE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION

EMPLOYEES; INDEXING THE MINIMUM SALARY TO THE RATE OF

INFLATION; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 10-7-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1974, Chapter 10, Section 2) is amended to read:

"10-7-9. MINIMUM SALARY RATE.--Every state employee and every person regularly employed at a state educational institution named in Article 12, Section 11 of the constitution of New Mexico [constitution], except student employees as defined by the [board of educational finance] commission on higher education, shall receive a salary at a rate equal to at least four hundred dollars (\$400) per month, .139779.1

the Personnel Act shall receive a salary at a rate equal to at least seven dollars fifty cents (\$7.50) per hour for fiscal year 2003. After fiscal year 2003, every state employee and state educational institution employee described in this section shall receive a salary at a rate equal to at least:

A. eight dollars fifty cents (\$8.50) per hour for fiscal year 2004;

B. nine dollars fifty cents (\$9.50) per hour for fiscal year 2005; and

C. a rate per hour adjusted for inflation and determined annually by the state personnel office for each fiscal year thereafter. The adjusted rate per hour for any fiscal year shall be determined by multiplying nine dollars fifty cents (\$9.50) by a fraction, the numerator of which is the consumer price index ending during the calendar year prior to the beginning of the fiscal year and the denominator of which is the consumer price index ending in calendar year 2004. The result of the multiplication shall be rounded down to the nearest tenth of a dollar, except that if the result would be an amount less than the rate for the preceding fiscal year, then no adjustment shall be made for that fiscal year. For purposes of this subsection, "consumer price index" means the average of the consumer price index for all urban consumers published by the United States department of labor

for the four quarterly periods ending December 31 of the calendar year. The state personnel office shall publish annually the rate determined by the calculation and distribute it to state agencies and state educational institutions subject to the provisions of this section."

Section 2. APPROPRIATION. -- Six hundred twenty-four thousand dollars (\$624,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the department of finance and administration for expenditure in fiscal year 2003 for salary increases necessary to comply with the provisions of this act. Salary increases required pursuant to this act shall be effective the first full pay period after July 1, 2002. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2003 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2002.
