11	RELATING TO EMERGENCIES; PROVIDING FOR THE TEMPORARY LICENSURE
12	OF CERTAIN PERSONS DURING AN EMERGENCY; DECLARING AN

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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 61-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1957,
17	Chapter 247, Section 2, as amended by Laws 1993, Chapter 49,
18	Section 31 and by Laws 1993, Chapter 171, Section 25 and also
19	by Laws 1993, Chapter 295, Section 1) is amended to read:
20	"61-1-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Uniform Licensing
21	Act:
22	A. "board" means:
23	(1) the construction industries commission,
24	the construction industries division and the electrical
25	bureau, mechanical bureau and general construction bureau of
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1	the construction industries division of the regulation and
2	licensing department;
3	(2) the manufactured housing committee and
4	manufactured housing division of the regulation and licensing
5	department;
6	(3) a board, commission or agency that
7	administers a profession or occupation licensed pursuant to
8	Chapter 61 NMSA 1978; and
9	(4) any other state agency to which the
10	Uniform Licensing Act is applied by law;
11	B. "applicant" means a person who has applied for
12	a license;
13	C. "license" means a certificate, permit or other
14	authorization to engage in each of the professions and
15	occupations regulated by the boards enumerated in Subsection A
16	of this section;
17	D. "revoke a license" means to prohibit the
18	conduct authorized by the license; [and]
19	E. "suspend a license" means to prohibit, for a
20	stated period of time, the conduct authorized by the license.
21	"Suspend a license" also means to allow, for a stated period
22	of time, the conduct authorized by the license, subject to
23	conditions that are reasonably related to the grounds for
24	suspension; <u>and</u>
25	F. "emergency" includes any man-made or natural
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disaster causing or threatening widespread physical or

2 <u>economic harm that is beyond local control and requires the</u>
3 resources of the state. "

4 Section 2. A new section of the Uniform Licensing Act is
5 enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] OUT-OF-STATE LICENSE HOLDERS--POWERS--6 7 DUTIES. -- During an emergency, a person who holds a license, 8 certificate or other permit that is issued by a state or 9 territory of the United States and that evidences the meeting 10 of qualifications for professional, mechanical or other skills 11 may be credentialed, if appropriate and approved by the 12 department of health or the department of public safety, to 13 render aid involving those skills to meet an emergency, 14 subject to such limitations and conditions as the governor may 15 prescribe by executive order or otherwise. Such a person 16 shall be considered a public employee for the purposes of the 17 Tort Claims Act when approved to perform such duties."

Section 3. A new section of the Uniform Licensing Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] APPLICATION.--The provisions of Section 2 of this act apply to a person from any state or territory whether or not a party to the Emergency Management Assistance Compact."

Section 4. A new section of the Uniform Licensing Act is enacted to read:

2	DUTIESDuring an emergency, a person who holds a license,

12	peace, health and safety that this act take effect
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
