WHEREAS, the Health Professional Loan Repayment Act provides for repayment of a student's loans for his health care education, provided the health professional commits to practice in designated health professional shortage areas; and . 140389. 1

WHEREAS, these programs represent some of the initiatives through which health professionals are encouraged to practice in rural, medically underserved and health professional shortage areas; and

WHEREAS, the legislative health and human services committee and the legislative health subcommittee have heard testimony on the shortage of health professionals throughout New Mexico: and

WHEREAS, counties, municipalities and other political subdivisions continually struggle to ensure the availability of health care services, despite limited or nonexistent resources: and

WHEREAS, the shortage of health professionals and the health care inflation rate will continue to place significant demands on the health care system and the economy of the state: and

WHEREAS, recruitment and retention of physicians and other health care providers to rural, medically underserved and health professional shortage areas requires a focused and coordinated approach;
