15	Section 1. APPROPRIATIONWOMEN'S PROGRAMSix hundred
16	thousand dollars (\$600,000) is appropriated from the general
17	fund to the department of health for expenditure in fiscal
18	years 2003 and 2004 for the purpose of contracting for women's
19	alcoholism and substance abuse treatment services based in
20	Velarde in Rio Arriba county, to include gender-specific and
21	culturally appropriate components of substance abuse and
22	psychological counseling, human immunodeficiency virus and
23	hepatitis virus counseling, preventive health and life skills
24	education, academic remediation, transportation, housing, child
25	care, nutrition specific to the healing of addiction,

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<u>underscored mterial = new</u> [bracketed mterial] = delete employment referral and training, long-term case management and follow-up services. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2004 shall revert to the general fund.

APPROPRIATION -- DETOXIFICATION SERVICES. -- Four Section 2. 6 hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated from the 7 general fund to the department of health for expenditure in 8 fiscal years 2003 and 2004 for the purpose of contracting for a 9 regional medically supervised best-practices alcohol and 10 substance abuse detoxification program, based in Rio Arriba 11 county, including nutrition specific to the healing of 12 addiction and culturally appropriate residential services in 13 the county facility in Velarde, to address the medical and 14 psychiatric needs of persons detoxifying from alcohol, heroin 15 and other opiates, sedatives and stimulant addictions. Any 16 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 17 fiscal year 2004 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 3. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
