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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
16	"Contractual Common Household Act".
17	Section 2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Contractual
18	Common Household Act:
19	A. "common household member" means an adult who
20	enters into a contractual common household with another;
21	B. "contractual common household" means the
22	exclusive legal union of two adults of any blood relationship
23	to maximize domestic benefits and commit to shared domestic
24	responsibilities; and
25	C. "filing of a contractual common household" means
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1 the day and hour at which a county clerk receives a contractual 2 common household form and a fee of twenty-five dollars 3 (\$25.00). 4 Section 3. PRESUMPTIONS.--Common household members are 5 presumed to: 6 be competent to enter a contract to receive Α. 7 benefits that are available to each other separately, 8 including: 9 inheritance; (1) 10 (2) health, retirement, retiree member 11 contribution, pension and survivor benefits; 12 property subject to Section 5 of the (3) 13 Contractual Common Household Act; and 14 the privilege not to testify against each (4) 15 other; 16 be competent to act as surrogates for each other Β. 17 for the purpose of medical decision-making and to make, revoke 18 or object to an anatomical gift of a decedent ally; 19 purchase property jointly; C. 20 assume for a child born or adopted by one or D. 21 both common household members all the duties of parentage; and 22 Ε. be subject to statutory nepotism restrictions. 23 Section 4. ISSUES RELATED TO CHILDREN AND PARENTING.--The 24 Contractual Common Household Act does not affect existing child 25 custody, visitation or parenting agreements, legitimize a child .169743.1 - 2 -

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born into or adopted into a contractual common household or
legitimize an incestuous sexual relationship between blood
relations, including between a grandparent and grandchild,
parent and child, aunt or uncle and nephew or niece and sibling
or half-sibling and another sibling or half-sibling. A
contractual common household involving an incestuous sexual
relationship is prohibited and shall be declared void.

Section 5. DISPOSITION OF PROPERTY IN A CONTRACTUAL COMMON HOUSEHOLD.--Property in a contractual common household shall be classed as follows:

A. "separate property" is that property:

(1) acquired before filing the contractual common household or after dissolving the contractual common household;

(2) designated as separate property by a judgment or decree of any court having jurisdiction; or

(3) received by either common household memberby gift, bequest, devise or descent; and

B. "joint property" is that property acquired during the contractual common household, including property acquired by an instrument in writing signed by either common household member, unless such property is separate property within the meaning of Subsection A of this section.

Section 6. DEBT.--The debt of a contractual common household is:

1	A. "separate debt" if:
2	(1) contracted for or incurred by a common
3	household member before filing of a contractual common
4	household or after entry of a decree of dissolution of a
5	contractual common household;
6	(2) designated as a separate debt by a common
7	household member to a creditor at the time of contracting for
8	the debt;
9	(3) incurred pursuant to a tort committed by a
10	common household member prior to filing the contractual common
11	household or after entry of a decree of dissolution of the
12	contractual common household; or
13	(4) a result of legal gambling; and
14	B. "joint debt" if contracted for or incurred by
15	either or both common household members during a contractual
16	common household and not classified as a separate debt pursuant
17	to Subsection A of this section.
18	Section 7. EXCLUSIVITYA person shall enter no more
19	than one contractual common household at a time. A common
20	household member shall dissolve one contractual common
21	household before filing another. A married person shall not
22	file a contractual common household until divorced or widowed.
23	Section 8. JURISDICTIONThe district court has
24	jurisdiction over proceedings relating to the dissolution of a
25	contractual common household or legal separation of common
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1	household members. The distric	et court shall apply the relevant			
2	contract provisions for dissolu	tion of a contractual common			
3	household.				
4	Section 9. CONTRACTUAL CO	OMMON HOUSEHOLD FORMS
