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## HOUSE BILL 373

# 49TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - FIRST SESSION, 2009

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AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL PERSONNEL; REQUIRING LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD APPROVAL ON THE LOCAL SUPERINTENDENT'S EMPLOYMENT, ASSIGNMENT, TERMINATION OR DISCHARGE OF OTHER SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS AND ADMINISTRATIVE DEPARTMENT HEADS; ALLOWING THE LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD TO PERFORM THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE LOCAL SUPERINTENDENT WHEN THE POSITION IS VACANT; SUBJECTING THE BOARD'S ACTIONS TO REVIEW BY THE PUBLIC EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 22-5-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967, Chapter 16, Section 28, as amended) is amended to read:

"22-5-4. LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS--POWERS--DUTIES.--A local school board shall have the following powers or duties:

subject to the rules of the department, develop educational policies for the school district;

13	$[G.]$ $\underline{H.}$ issue general obligation bonds of the						
14	school district;						
15	[H.] <u>I.</u> provide for the repair of and maintain all						
16	property belonging to the school district;						
17	$[\frac{\mathbf{J}_{\bullet}}{\mathbf{J}_{\bullet}}]$ for good cause and upon order of the						
18	district court, subpoena witnesses and documents in connection						
19	with a hearing concerning any powers or duties of the local						
20	school board;						
21	$[J_{\bullet}]$ K. except for expenditures for salaries,						
22	contract for the expenditure of money according to the						
23	provisions of the Procurement Code;						
24	$[K_{ullet}]$ $\underline{L}_{ullet}$ adopt rules pertaining to the						
25	administration of all powers or duties of the local school						
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[1. ] M. accept or reject any charitable gift, grant, devise or bequest. The particular gift, grant, devise or bequest accepted shall be considered an asset of the school district or the public school to which it is given;

[M.] N. offer and, upon compliance with the conditions of such offer, pay rewards for information leading to the arrest and conviction or other appropriate disciplinary disposition by the courts or juvenile authorities of offenders in case of theft, defacement or destruction of school district property. All such rewards shall be paid from school district funds in accordance with rules promulgated by the department; [and

 $\mathbb{N}$ .] 0. give prior approval for any educational program in a public school in the school district that is to be conducted, sponsored, carried on or caused to be carried on by a private organization or agency; and

P. if the local school board determines by majority vote that the local superintendent has taken any personnel action that would adversely affect the school district, the action may be appealed to the department for review and determination. The determination by the department to overrule or concur with the appeal shall be final."

Section 2. Section 22-5-14 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003, Chapter 153, Section 25) is amended to read:

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"22-5-14.	LOCAL	SUPERINTENDENT-	-POWERS	AND	DUTTES

- Α. The local superintendent is the [chief executive officer] instructional leader and manager of the school district.
  - The local superintendent shall:
- (1) carry out the educational policies and rules of the [state board] department and local school board;
- administer and supervise the school (2) district;
- employ, fix the salaries of and assign, (3) terminate or discharge all employees of the school district, subject to approval of the local school board for school administrators and administrative department heads and subject to concurrence by the department with personnel appeals of the local school board as provided in Section 22-5-4 NMSA 1978;
- (4) prepare the school district budget based on public schools' recommendations for review and approval by the local school board and the department. The local superintendent shall tell each school principal the approximate amount of money that may be available for [his] the principal's school and provide a school budget template to use in making school budget recommendations; and
- perform other duties as required by law, (5) the department or the local school board.
- The local superintendent may apply to the [state .175554.1

board] department for a waiver of certain provisions of the Public School Code relating to length of school day, staffing patterns, subject area or the purchase of instructional materials for the purpose of implementing a collaborative school improvement program for an individual public school."

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
