# A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO DIRECT THE INTERIM COMMITTEE THAT ADDRESSES WATER AND NATURAL RESOURCES ISSUES TO HEAR TESTIMONY ON FEED-IN TARIFFS FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY.
