17	THE SAME SECTION OF LAW IN LAWS 2011.
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
20	SECTION 1. Section 22-10A-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
21	Chapter 153, Section 38, as amended) is amended to read:
22	"22-10A-7. LEVEL ONE LICENSURE
23	A. A level one license is a provisional five-year
24	license for beginning teachers that requires as a condition of
25	licensure that the licensee undergo a formal mentorship program

<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete for at least one full school year and an annual intensive performance evaluation by a school administrator for at least three full school years before applying for a level two license.

Β. Each school district, in accordance with 5 department rules, shall provide for the mentorship and 6 evaluation of level one teachers. At the end of each year and 7 at the end of the license period, the level one teacher shall 8 9 be evaluated for competency. If the teacher fails to demonstrate satisfactory progress and competence annually, the 10 teacher may be terminated as provided in Section 22-10A-24 NMSA 11 12 1978. If the teacher has not demonstrated satisfactory progress and competence by the end of the five-year period, the 13 14 teacher shall not be granted a level two license.

C. Except in exigent circumstances defined by department rule, a level one license shall not be extended beyond the initial period.

D. The department shall issue a standard level one license to an applicant who is at least eighteen years of age who:

(1) holds a baccalaureate degree from an accredited educational institution;

(2) has successfully completed a departmentapproved teacher preparation program from a nationally accredited or state-approved educational institution; .188226.1

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1 has passed the New Mexico teacher (3) 2 assessments examination, including for elementary licensure beginning January 1, 2013, a rigorous assessment of the 3 candidate's knowledge of the science of teaching reading; and 4 5 (4) meets other qualifications for level one licensure, including clearance of the required background 6 7 check. The department shall post on its web site the 8 Ε. 9 results of a rigorous assessment of an elementary licensure candidate's knowledge of the science of teaching reading: 10 (1) including the name of the nationally 11 12 accredited or state-approved educational institution, but not the candidate's name; and 13 14 (2) within six weeks of the examination. $[\underline{E_{\cdot}}]$ <u>F</u>. The department shall issue an alternative 15 level one license to an applicant who meets the requirements of 16 Section 22-10A-8 NMSA 1978. 17 $[F_{\cdot}]$ <u>G.</u> The department shall establish competencies 18 and qualifications for specific grade levels, types and subject 19 20 areas of level one licensure, including early childhood, elementary, middle school, secondary, special education and 21 vocational education. 22 [G.] H. Beginning with the 2003-2004 school year, 23 with the adoption by the department of a highly objective 24 uniform statewide standard of evaluation for level one 25 .188226.1

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1 teachers, the minimum salary for a level one teacher shall be 2 thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for a standard nine and onehalf month contract. 3 [H.] I. Teachers who hold level one licenses on the 4 5 effective date of the 2003 act must be evaluated by the end of the 2006-2007 school year." 6 7 SECTION 2. ALTERNATIVE LEVEL ONE LICENSE.--11 12 The department shall issue an alternative level Α. one license to a person who is at least eighteen years of age 13 14 and who: has completed a baccalaureate degree at an 15 (1)accredited institution of higher education and has received a 16 17 passing score on a state-approved subject-area examination in 18 the subject area of instruction for which the person is 19 applying for a license; or 20 (2) has completed a master's degree at an accredited institution of higher education, including 21 completion of a minimum of twelve graduate credit hours in the 22 subject area of instruction for which the person is applying 23 for a license; or 24 has completed a doctoral or law degree at 25 (3) .188226.1

2	(4) has passed the New Mexico teacher
3	assessments examination, including for elementary licensure
4	beginning January 1, 2013, a rigorous assessment of the

7	completes a minimum of twelve semester hours of instruction in
8	teaching principles in a program approved by the department; or

14	B. A degree or examination referred to in
15	Subsection A of this section shall correspond to the subject
16	area of instruction and the particular grade level that will
17	enable the applicant to teach in a competent manner as
18	determined by the department.
19	C. The department shall post on its web site the
20	results of a rigorous assessment of an alternative elementary
21	licensure candidate's knowledge of the science of teaching
22	reading:
23	(1) including the name of the nationally
24	accredited or state-approved educational institution, but not
25	the candidate's name; and
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1	(2) within six weeks of the examination.
2	[C.] <u>D.</u> An alternative level one teacher shall
3	participate in the same mentorship, evaluation and other
4	professional development requirements as other level one
5	teachers.
6	$[D_{\bullet}] = A$ school district or state agency shall not
7	discriminate against a teacher on the basis that the teacher
8	holds an alternative level one license.
9	$[E_{\bullet}]$ <u>F</u> . The department shall provide by rule for
10	training and other requirements to support the use of
11	unlicensed content area experts as resources in classrooms,
12	team teaching, on-line instruction, curriculum development and
13	other purposes."
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
