SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 263 appropriates \$15,000 from the general fund to the Local Government Division of the Department of Finance and Administration for expenditure in fiscal years 2012 and 2013 for the Espanola Fiesta.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$15,000 contained in this bill is a nonrecurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2013 shall revert to the general fund.

Senate Bill 263 – Page 2

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The DFA notes that the Espanola fiestas have not been funded with taxpayer dollars in past years and suggests that the city should find other alternatives to using taxpayer money to support its annual celebration in the current year.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

The DFA points out that current language in the bill allows for expenditures in fiscal year 2012. However, since there is no emergency clause in the bill, the effective date of the legislation will be July 1, 2012.

AMENDMENTS

The DFA points out that language reads, "...for expenditure in fiscal years 2012 and 2013 to fund the Espanola fiesta." There is no emergency clause for the appropriation. Without an emergency clause this appropriation will go into effect on July 1, 2012, and no funds will be spent in fiscal year 2012.

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

If the bill is not enacted, the City of Espanola will need to pursue other funding sources for its annual fiesta celebration.
