14	NURSE-MIDWIVES TO PERFORM CERTAIN ULTRASOUND PROCEDURES.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 61-14E-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983,
18	Chapter 317, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"61-14E-4. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Medical Imaging
20	and Radiation Therapy Health and Safety Act:
21	A. "advisory council" means the medical imaging and
22	radiation therapy advisory council;
23	B. "board" means the environmental improvement
24	board;
25	C. "certificate of limited practice" means a
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1 certificate issued pursuant to the Medical Imaging and 2 Radiation Therapy Health and Safety Act to persons who perform restricted diagnostic radiography under direct supervision of a 3 licensed practitioner limited to the following specific 4 5 procedures: the viscera of the thorax; 6 (1) 7 (2) extremities; radiation to humans for diagnostic 8 (3) purposes in the practice of dentistry; 9 (4) axial/appendicular skeleton; or 10 the foot, ankle or lower leg; 11 (5) 12 D. "certified nurse practitioner" means a person licensed pursuant to Section 61-3-23.2 NMSA 1978; 13 "credential" or "certification" means the Ε. 14 recognition awarded to an individual who meets the requirements 15 of a credentialing or certification organization; 16 "credentialing organization" or "certification 17 F. organization" means a nationally recognized organization 18 recognized by the board that issues credentials or 19 20 certification through testing or evaluations that determine whether an individual meets defined standards for training and 21 competence in a medical imaging modality; 22 G. 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including a vascular technologist or echocardiographer, other than a licensed practitioner, who provides patient care services using ultrasound;

"division" means the environmental health bureau Τ. of the field operations and infrastructure division of the department [of environment];

"ionizing radiation" means alpha particles, beta particles, gamma rays, x-rays, neutrons, high-speed electrons, 8 9 high-speed protons and other particles capable of producing ions; "ionizing radiation" does not include non-ionizing 10 radiation, such as sound waves, radio waves or microwaves, or 12 visible, infrared or ultraviolet light;

Κ. "license" means a document issued by the department pursuant to the Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Health and Safety Act to an individual who has met the requirements of licensure;

"licensed practitioner" means a person licensed L. to practice medicine, dentistry, podiatry, chiropractic or osteopathy in this state;

Μ. "licensure" means a grant of authority through a license or limited license to perform specific medical imaging and radiation therapy services pursuant to the Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Health and Safety Act;

"magnetic resonance technologist" means a person N. other than a licensed practitioner who performs magnetic

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1 resonance procedures under the supervision of a licensed 2 practitioner using magnetic fields and radio frequency signals; "medical imaging" means the use of substances or 3 0. equipment emitting ionizing or non-ionizing radiation on humans 4 for diagnostic or interventional purposes; 5 Ρ. "medical imaging modality" means: 6 7 (1)diagnostic medical sonography and all of its subspecialties; 8 9 (2) magnetic resonance imaging and all of its subspecialties; 10 nuclear medicine technology and all of its (3) 11 12 subspecialties; radiation therapy and all of its (4) 13 14 subspecialties; and radiography and all of its subspecialties; (5) 15 "medical imaging professional" means a person 0. 16 who is a magnetic resonance technologist, radiographer, nuclear 17 medicine technologist or diagnostic medical sonographer and who 18 is licensed pursuant to the Medical Imaging and Radiation 19 20 Therapy Health and Safety Act; "non-ionizing radiation" means the [optical R. 21 radiations, including ultraviolet, visible, infrared and 22 lasers] static and time-varying electric and magnetic fields 23 and radio frequency, including microwave radiation and 24 25 ultrasound; .191098.3

"nuclear medicine technologist" means a person 2 other than a licensed practitioner who applies radiopharmaceutical agents to humans for diagnostic or 3 therapeutic purposes under the direction of a licensed 4 5 practitioner; "physician assistant" means a person licensed т. 6 7 pursuant to Section 61-6-7 or 61-10A-4 NMSA 1978; "radiation therapy" means the application of 8 U. 9 ionizing radiation to humans for therapeutic purposes; "radiation therapy technologist" means a person 10 V. other than a licensed practitioner whose application of 11 radiation to humans is for therapeutic purposes; 12 "radiographer" means a person other than a W. 13 licensed practitioner whose application of radiation to humans 14 is for diagnostic purposes; 15 "radiography" means the application of radiation Χ. 16 to humans for diagnostic purposes, including adjustment or 17 manipulation of x-ray systems and accessories, including image 18 receptors, positioning of patients, processing of films and any 19 20 other action that materially affects the radiation dose to patients; 21 Υ. "radiologist" means a licensed practitioner 22 certified by the American board of radiology, the British royal 23 college of radiology, the American osteopathic board of 24 radiology or the American chiropractic board of radiology; and 25 .191098.3

"radiologist assistant" means an individual 2 licensed as a radiographer as defined in the Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Health and Safety Act who holds 3 additional certification as a registered radiologist assistant 4 by the American registry of radiologic technologists and who 5 works under the supervision of a radiologist; provided that a 6 7 radiologist assistant shall not interpret images, render diagnoses or prescribe medications or therapies." 8 9 SECTION 2. Section 61-14E-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983, Chapter 317, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read: 10 "61-14E-7. LICENSURE--EXCEPTIONS.--11 12 Α. It is unlawful, unless licensed by the department as a medical imaging professional or radiation 13 14 therapist, for any person to: (1) use ionizing or non-ionizing radiation on 15 16 humans; (2) use any title, abbreviation, letters, 17 figures, signs or other devices to indicate that the person is 18 19 a licensed medical imaging professional or radiation therapist; 20 or engage in any of the medical imaging (3) 21 modalities as defined by the Medical Imaging and Radiation 22 Therapy Health and Safety Act. 23 Notwithstanding any other provision of the Β. 24 Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Health and Safety Act, 25 .191098.3

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1 the requirement of a medical imaging license shall not apply 2 to: 3 (1) a licensed practitioner [or auxiliary or health practitioner licensed or certified by an independent 4 board; provided that any certification and examination program 5 for auxiliaries or health practitioners established by an 6 7 independent board shall be submitted to the advisory council 8 and approved by the board]; or (2) a registered nurse or certified nurse-9 midwife performing ultrasound procedures; provided that the 10 registered nurse or certified nurse-midwife has documented 11 12 demonstration of competency within the registered nurse's scope of practice in compliance with board of nursing rules or 13 certified nurse-midwife's scope of practice in compliance with 14 department of health rules. A registered nurse or a certified 15 nurse-midwife may perform ultrasound procedures limited to a 16 focused imaging target for the purpose of clinical decision-17 making. A registered nurse or certified nurse-midwife shall 18 not perform ultrasound for any other purpose. 19 20 C. The requirement of a medical imaging license shall also not apply to a student who is enrolled in and 21 attending a required individual education program of a school 22

or college of medicine, osteopathy, chiropractic, podiatry, dentistry or dental hygiene to apply radiation to humans under the supervision of a licensed practitioner or under the direct

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supervision of a licensed medical imaging professional or
 radiation therapist.

[G.] D. Notwithstanding any other provision of the 3 Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Health and Safety Act, 4 the requirement of a license shall not apply to a student 5 completing clinical requirements of an approved education 6 7 program working under the supervision of a licensed practitioner or under the direct supervision of a medical 8 9 imaging professional or radiation therapist licensed in the practice for which the student is seeking licensure. 10

 $[\overline{D_{\cdot}}] \xrightarrow{E_{\cdot}}$ The department shall adopt rules and regulations for the education and licensure of advanced medical imaging professionals.

 $[E_{\cdot}]$ <u>F</u>. The department may require students in medical imaging and radiation therapy educational programs to register with the department while enrolled in an approved education program.

G. A registered nurse or a certified nurse-midwife shall not perform ionizing procedures, including radiography, radiation therapy, nuclear medicine or a non-ionizing magnetic resonance procedure, unless licensed by the department as a medical imaging professional. Nothing in the Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Health and Safety Act shall affect the authority of a health care professional licensed pursuant to Chapter 24 or Chapter 61 NMSA 1978 to order or use images
