

A MEMORIAL

DECLARING MARCH 1, 2013 "TIME MANAGEMENT DAY" IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NEW MEXICO AND URGING ITS MEMBERS TO USE THEIR TIME EFFICIENTLY AND IN A BENEFICIAL MANNER BEFITTING THEIR POSITIONS.
