SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 292 changes the Horse Racing Act related to 60-1A-11, Granting a License.

E. An occupational license shall be denied or revoked if the applicant or occupational licensee [~~for the purpose of stimulating or depressing a racehorse or affecting its speed or stamina during a race or workout~~] is found to have:

(1) administered, attempted to administer or conspired to administer to a racehorse, internally, externally or by injection, a drug, chemical, stimulant or depressant, or other foreign substances not naturally occurring in a racehorse [~~unless the applicant or occupational licensee has been specifically permitted to do so by the commission or a steward~~] and known to the official chemist to stimulate or depress a racehorse or to affect its speed or stamina during a race or workout, notwithstanding a claim that the injection, drug, chemical, stimulant or depressant or other foreign substance has a use that is otherwise beneficial to a racehorse; or

(2) attempted to use, used or conspired with others to use an electrical or mechanical device, implement or instrument, except an ordinary whip, to stimulate or depress a racehorse or to affect its speed or stamina during a race or workout, unless the applicant or occupational licensee has been specifically permitted by the commission or a steward to use the device, implement or instrument.
