Synopsis of HFI Amendment #1

House Floor Amendment 1 to Senate Joint Memorial 18 extends the Ben Lujan Memorial Highway from Santa Fe to Espanola except to the portion of the highway dedicated to Jacob Villarreal, former Governor of the Pojoaque Pueblo.

Synopsis of Original Bill

Senate Joint Memorial 18 resolves the State Transportation Commission rename a portion of United States Highway 285 traveling between Nambe and Espanola the Ben Lujan Memorial Highway.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be costs in changing signage along the highway. The Department of Transportation estimate in another analysis for the cost to change signs for renaming monuments would be approximately \$15 thousand and this was used to estimate signage costs.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Speaker Lujan served as the Speaker of the House of Representatives form 2001 and 2012 and as a representative from 1975 until 2012. In addition, he served as Santa Fe County Commissioner. He provided great leadership to the Legislature working on behalf of all New Mexicans. Battling
