WHEREAS, Walter Cecil "Dub" Williams, Jr., who served as a  
state representative for district fifty-six for fifteen years,  
died in Ruidoso on October 27, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Dub was born on November 17, 1927 in Bogalusa,  
Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, Dub moved to Lincoln county in 1944 and married,  
ranching and raised a family there; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from high school, Dub enlisted  
in the United States Navy for two years and then attended New  
Mexico state university, where he graduated with a bachelor of  
science degree in business administration and education; and

WHEREAS, Dub was a school teacher and a coach for twenty-

2 founder of the Ruidoso high school scholastic banquet; and

3 WHEREAS, Dub was passionate about Ruidoso football and was  
4 the broadcast announcer at the Ruidoso football stadium,  
5 calling every football game for many, many years; and

6 WHEREAS, Dub had a heart for his community and his  
7 community had a heart for him, leading him to serve as chairman  
8 of the Lincoln county medical center and as chairman of the  
9 water defense association; and

10 WHEREAS, Dub was elected and served in the New Mexico  
11 house of representatives from 1995 to 2009; and

12 WHEREAS, Dub represented Lincoln, Chaves and Otero  
13 counties, where he was a respected advocate for his beliefs and  
14 where he was held in high regard; and

15 WHEREAS, during his legislative career, Dub served on many  
16 standing and interim committees, with a keen interest in  
17 agricultural and water resource issues and public school  
18 funding issues; and

19 WHEREAS, Dub was known for his warm, gentle style and his  
20 ability to defuse contentious debate; and

21 WHEREAS, with his passing, the state lost a respected  
22 leader, mentor and statesman; and

23 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife of sixty-four years,  
24 Kathryn Hale Williams; his brothers, Charles Sherwin Williams
