SENATE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 60

Honorable President Pro Tempore Papen and Members of the Senate:

Pursuant to the Constitution of the State of New Mexico, Article IV, Section 22, I hereby VETO and return SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL 259, as amended, enacted by the Fifty-Third Legislature, First Session, 2017.

Domestic abuse incidents are complex and, often, very difficult and emotional for everyone involved. The type of actions that can result in the issuance of a civil protection order run the gamut from trespassing to physical violence and, at times, criminal charges may ultimately be filed – where, rightfully, many of one’s constitutional liberties may be abridged.

Our judges already have the power to prohibit individuals that are subject to a civil restraining order from possessing a firearm—whenever they feel that it is warranted—and I would encourage them to exercise this power whenever the facts and circumstances before them require it.

Because this power already exists in our judiciary, I hereby veto Senate Bill 259.
