16	SECTION 1. A new section of the Public Health Act is
17	enacted to read:

20	A. The "palliative care advisory council" is
21	created. The council shall advise the department of health,

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1 care initiatives in the state to increase awareness of, access 2 to and use of palliative care services. The council is administratively attached to the 3 Β. department of health. Members of the council shall be 4 appointed by the secretary of health and shall include an 5 interdisciplinary group of: 6 7 (1) medical, nursing, social work, pharmacy and spiritual professionals with expertise in palliative care; 8 9 and palliative care patients, family 10 (2) caregivers and patient advocates. 11 12 C. In addition to members appointed pursuant to Subsection B of this section, the council shall include the 13 following ex-officio members: 14 the secretary of human services or the 15 (1)secretary's designee; 16 the secretary of Indian affairs or the 17 (2) secretary's designee; and 18 the secretary of health or the secretary's 19 (3) 20 designee. Membership of the council shall include health D. 21 professionals having palliative care work experience or 22 expertise in palliative care delivery models: 23 in a variety of inpatient, outpatient and (1)24 community settings, including acute care, long-term care and 25 .205259.3 - 2 -

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(2) with a variety of populations, including pediatric, youth and adult populations.

E. At least two council members shall be certified hospice and palliative medicine physicians or nurses.

F. Council members shall serve for a period of three years.

G. By December 1, 2017, the secretary of health shall convene the council for its first meeting, at which council members shall elect a chair and vice chair, whose duties shall be established by the council, and shall fix a time and place for regular meetings of the council, which shall meet at least twice yearly. Council members shall receive no compensation for their services.

H. As used in this section, "palliative care" means patient- and family-centered medical care that optimizes the quality of life by anticipating, preventing and treating suffering caused by serious illness. Palliative care throughout the continuum of illness involves addressing physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs and facilitating patient autonomy, access to information and choice. "Palliative care" includes discussions of the patient's goals for treatment; discussion of treatment options for the patient, including, where appropriate, hospice care; and comprehensive pain and symptom management."

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SECTION 2. A new section of the Public Health Act is
 enacted to read:

3 "[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] VIVA LA VIDA PROGRAM ESTABLISHED-4 PURPOSE--ACTIVITIES.--

A. The "viva la vida" program is created as a statewide program to educate patients, family caregivers and health care providers about improving quality of life through the provision of palliative care.

9 Β. The purpose of the viva la vida program is to 10 maximize the awareness of, access to and use of palliative care 11 initiatives in the state by ensuring that comprehensive and 12 accurate information and education about palliative care are 13 available to the public, health care providers and health 14 facilities. The department of health shall consult with the palliative care advisory council established pursuant to 15 Section 1 of this 2017 act in implementing the viva la vida 16 17 program.

C. The department of health shall publish on its website information and resources, including links to external resources, about patient and family caregiver quality of life and palliative care for the public, health care providers and health facilities. This information shall include:

(1) continuing educational opportunities for health care providers;

10	D. The department of health may develop and
11	implement any other initiatives regarding the viva la vida
12	program and palliative care services information and education
13	that the department of health determines would further the
14	purposes of this section.
15	E. As used in this section:
16	(1) "medical care" means services provided,
17	requested or supervised by a physician or advanced practice
18	nurse;
19	(2) "palliative care" means patient- and
20	family-centered medical care that optimizes the quality of life
21	by anticipating, preventing and treating suffering caused by
22	serious illness. Palliative care throughout the continuum of
23	illness involves addressing physical, emotional, social and
24	spiritual needs and facilitating patient autonomy, access to
25	information and choice. "Palliative care" includes discussions
