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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: 2 SECTION 1. SESSION EXPENSES.--3 There is appropriated from the general fund for Α. the expense of the legislative department of the state of New 4 Mexico for the first session of the fifty-third legislature for 5 per diem and mileage of its members, for salaries of employees 6 7 and for other expenses of the legislature, eight million nine hundred forty-two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$8,942,800) 8 or so much thereof as may be necessary for such purposes. 9 Β. The expenditures referred to in Subsection A of 10 this section are as follows: 11 12 (1) per diem for senators . . . \$413,280; (2) per diem for members of the house of 13 14 (3) mileage traveled by members of the senate 15 going to and returning from the seat of government by the 16 usually traveled route, one round trip \$6,304; 17 (4) mileage traveled by members of the house 18 of representatives going to and returning from the seat of 19 government by the usually traveled route, one round trip 20 21 (5) salaries and employee benefits of senate 22 \$2,812,116; 23 (6) salaries and employee benefits of house of 24 25 .206139.1

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(7) for expense of the senate not itemized above, six hundred sixty-seven thousand six hundred dollars (\$667,600). No part of this item may be transferred to salaries or employee benefits;

for expense of the house of (8) representatives not itemized above, six hundred six thousand three hundred dollars (\$606,300). No part of this item may be transferred to salaries or employee benefits; and

(9) for session expenses of the legislative council service, the joint billroom and mailroom and joint 10 legislative switchboard, one million ninety-three thousand six 12 hundred dollars (\$1,093,600) to be disbursed upon vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee. 14

The expenditures for the senate shall be C. disbursed on vouchers signed by the chair of the committees' committee and the chief clerk of the senate or the chief clerk's designee. The expenditures for the house of representatives shall be disbursed on vouchers signed by the speaker and chief clerk of the house or the chief clerk's designee. Following adjournment of the session, expenditures authorized pursuant to Paragraphs (1) through (8) of Subsection B of this section shall be disbursed upon vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee.

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Under the printing contracts entered into for 1 D. 2 the first session of the fifty-third legislature, the chair of the committees' committee of the senate, subject to the 3 approval of the committee, and the speaker of the house of 4 representatives are authorized and directed to provide for the 5 printing of all bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, 6 7 memorials and joint memorials introduced in the senate or 8 house, the printing of the weekly bill locator and the printing 9 of all necessary stationery required for use in the respective They are further directed to provide for the purchase 10 houses. of all supplies necessary for use in the respective houses 11 12 within the appropriation provided. The orders for printing, stationery and supplies shall be approved by the chair of the 13 committees' committee for the senate and by the speaker for the 14 house. 15

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SECTION 2. BILLS AND OTHER PRINTED MATERIALS.--

A. For the first session of the fifty-third legislature, bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials and joint memorials delivered to the printer shall be returned by the printer to the joint billroom within forty-two hours after they are ordered to be printed. The billroom personnel shall supply a complete file of bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials, joint memorials and other printed distribution materials to the following:

(1) one copy to each member of the house of.206139.1- 4 -

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1 representatives and senate;

2 (2) upon written request, one copy to each
3 county clerk, district judge, radio or television station and
4 newspaper and to the general library of each state-supported
5 institution of higher learning; and

(3) upon written request, one copy to each state department, commission, board, institution or agency, each elected state official, each incorporated municipality, each district attorney, each ex-governor, each member of the New Mexico congressional delegation and each public school district in the state.

B. Any person not listed in Subsection A of this section may secure a complete file of the bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials and joint memorials of the legislature by depositing with the legislative council service the amount of seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750), which deposit shall be paid to the state treasurer to the credit of the legislative expense fund. Additional single copies of items of legislation shall be sold for two dollars (\$2.00) unless the director of the legislative council service shall, because of its length, assign a higher price not to exceed ten cents (\$.10) per page. Copies of a daily bill locator, other than those copies furnished to each member of the respective houses, shall be supplied by the legislative council service at a charge of two hundred sixty dollars (\$260) for the entire

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session.

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2 **SECTION 3.** LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SERVICE.--There is 3 appropriated from the general fund to the legislative council service for fiscal year 2018 unless otherwise indicated, to be 4 5 disbursed on vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee, the following: 6 7 Personal Services & Α. \$ 4,435,000 Employee Benefits 8 9 Contractual Services 225,000 1,000,000 10 Other Costs \$ 5,660,000; 11 Total 12 for travel expenses of legislators other than Β. New Mexico legislative council members, on legislative council 13 14 business, for committee travel, studies, staff and other necessary expenses for other interim committees and for other 15 necessary legislative expenses for fiscal year 2018, eight 16 hundred eighty-four thousand six hundred dollars (\$884,600); 17 18 provided that the New Mexico legislative council may transfer 19 amounts from the appropriation in this subsection, during the 20 fiscal year for which appropriated, to any other legislative appropriation where they may be needed; 21 for pre-session expenditures and for necessary С. 22

C. for pre-session expenditures and for necessary contracts, furniture, equipment, supplies and personnel for interim session preparation, three hundred ninety-seven thousand three hundred dollars (\$397,300); and

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1 D. for a statewide legislative intern program, 2 forty-six thousand six hundred dollars (\$46,600). **SECTION 4.** LEGISLATIVE FINANCE COMMITTEE.--There is 3 4 appropriated from the general fund to the legislative finance 5 committee for fiscal year 2018, to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the chair of the committee or the chair's designated 6 7 representative, the following: 8 Personal Services & Employee Benefits \$ 3,549,500 9 Contractual Services 259,600 Other Costs 291,200 10 \$ 4,100,300. Total 11 12 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION STUDY COMMITTEE.--There 13 is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative 14 education study committee for fiscal year 2018 to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the chair of the committee or the chair's 15 16 designated representative, the following: 17 Personal Services & Employee Benefits \$ 1,112,600 18 Contractual Services 16,500 19 Other Costs 104,300 20 Total \$ 1,233,400. SENATE RULES COMMITTEE.--There is appropriated 21 SECTION 6. from the general fund to the legislative council service for 22 the interim duties of the senate rules committee, nineteen 23 thousand one hundred dollars (\$19,100) for fiscal year 2018. 24 25 SECTION 7. HOUSE CHIEF CLERK. -- There is appropriated from

18	SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INFORMATION SYSTEMThere is
19	appropriated from the general fund to the legislative council
20	service for expenditure in fiscal years 2017 and 2018 for the
21	legislative information system, eight hundred fifty thousand
22	eight hundred dollars (\$850,800).
23	SECTION 10. EXTENSIBLE MARKUP LANGUAGE DATABASE
24	SELF-PUBLICATIONThere is appropriated from the legislative
25	cash balances to the legislative council service for the

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1 legislative share of the continued development required for the 2 extensible markup language database, extensible markup language 3 tagging and its use for legislative document systems and an integrated tagged database of the session laws and for the 4 costs associated in collaborating with the New Mexico 5 compilation commission on the ongoing development and expanding 6 7 partnership role in the self-publication of the New Mexico statutes annotated, 1978, four hundred thousand dollars 8 (\$400,000) for expenditure during fiscal years 2017 and 2018. 9

SECTION 11. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE NEW MEXICO SUPREME COURT.--Eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the New Mexico supreme court for expenditure in fiscal year 2017 for operational needs. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2017 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 12. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS.--Eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the administrative office of the courts for expenditure in fiscal year 2017 for the jury and witness fee fund and operational needs. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2017 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 13. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE TWELFTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT COURT.--Thirty-seven thousand one hundred dollars (\$37,100) is appropriated from the general fund to the .206139.1

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twelfth judicial district court for expenditure in fiscal year 2017 for operational needs. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2017 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 14. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE AGING AND LONG-TERM SERVICES DEPARTMENT.--Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the aging and long-term services department for expenditure in fiscal year 2017 to cover a projected shortfall in the adult protective services program. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2017 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 15. CATEGORY TRANSFER.--Amounts set out in Sections 3, 4, 5, 7 and 8 of this act are provided for informational purposes only and may be freely transferred among categories.

SECTION 16. PERFORMANCE MEASURES.--Each legislative agency shall adhere to the performance measures specified in its strategic plan and shall make reports as required in that plan.

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
