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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. A new section of the Legislative Lottery
18	Tuition Scholarship Act is enacted to read:
19	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIPREQUEST
20	FORMDEPARTMENT DETERMINATION
21	A. By August 1, 2017, the department shall develop
22	and provide to all public post-secondary educational
23	institutions a printed and electronic form for requesting a
24	lottery tuition scholarship.
25	B. No later than July 1, 2017 and no later than May

1 of each subsequent year, based on the amount appropriated by the legislature from the fund and on the projected enrollment at all public post-secondary educational institutions, the department shall:

determine the total amount of money 5 (1)available for lottery tuition scholarships at all public post-6 7 secondary educational institutions;

(2) maintain, increase or reduce the percentages of lottery tuition scholarships to award the maximum amount available while maintaining the solvency of the fund as projected in the most recent actuarial evaluation of 12 the fund; and

(3) notify all public post-secondary educational institutions of the determinations made pursuant to Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection."

SECTION 2. A new section of the Legislative Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP--APPLICATION BY STUDENT.--Prior to consideration for a lottery tuition scholarship each year, a student shall timely:

submit to the intended public post-secondary Α. educational institution a signed form requesting a lottery tuition scholarship; and

Β. file a free application for federal student aid provided pursuant to the federal Higher Education Act of 1965 .205374.2 - 2 -

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1 to produce an expected family contribution amount." 2 SECTION 3. Section 21-21N-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2014, 3 Chapter 80, Section 4, as amended) is repealed and a new Section 21-21N-4 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read: 4 5 "21-21N-4. [NEW MATERIAL] LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP--DIFFERENTIATED AWARDS.--6 7 The amount of a lottery tuition scholarship Α. 8 shall be a percentage of tuition and shall be based on the 9 program semester of enrollment and the type of public post-10 secondary educational institution the student is attending as follows: 11 12 for students attending a community (1) 13 college: 14 (a) for the first and second program semesters, up to sixty percent of tuition; and 15 for the third program semester, up 16 (b) bracketed material] = delete to one hundred percent of tuition; 17 18 (2) for students attending a comprehensive 19 institution: 20 (a) for the first program semester, up to forty percent of tuition; 21 for the second and third program (b) 22 semesters, up to fifty percent of tuition; 23 (c) for the fourth program semester, up 24 25 to eighty percent of tuition; and .205374.2 - 3 -

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1 (d) for the fifth through seventh 2 program semesters, up to one hundred percent of tuition; and 3 for students attending a research (3) institution: 4 5 (a) for the first program semester, up to forty percent of tuition; 6 7 (b) for the second and third program semesters, up to fifty percent of tuition; 8 9 (c) for the fourth program semester, up to eighty percent of tuition; and 10 for the fifth through seventh (d) 11 12 program semesters, up to one hundred percent of tuition. In determining distribution and awards for the Β. 13 14 lottery tuition scholarship program, the department shall: maintain the minimum fund balance pursuant (1) 15 to Section 21-21N-5 NMSA 1978: 16 distribute to all public post-secondary 17 (2) educational institutions an amount not to exceed the remaining 18 19 balance in the fund; and 20 (3) subject to the provisions of Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection, distribute to each public 21 post-secondary educational institution an amount based on: 22 (a) the projected enrollment at each 23 four-year public post-secondary educational institution of 24 qualified students in their first through seventh program 25 .205374.2 - 4 -

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1 semesters, including qualified students in their fourth through 2 seventh program semesters who transferred from community 3 colleges; (b) the projected enrollment at each 4 community college of qualified students in their first through 5 third program semesters; and 6 7 (c) a uniform percentage of the average of in-state tuition costs charged by: 1) research institutions 8 9 for each research institution; 2) comprehensive institutions for each comprehensive institution; and 3) community colleges 10 for each community college, except that the uniform percentage 11 12 for a two-year state educational institution shall be based on the uniform percentage for community colleges." 13 Section 21-21N-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2014, SECTION 4. 14 Chapter 80, Section 6) is amended to read: 15 "21-21N-6. 7	B. Immediately after promulgation, the rules shall
8	be distributed to boards of regents and governing boards of
9	public post-secondary educational institutions.
10	[B.] <u>C.</u> The department shall report by November 1
11	of each year to the legislative finance committee and the
12	department of finance and administration on:
13	(1) the status of the fund;
14	(2) tuition scholarship program
15	participation data aggregated for each public post-secondary
16	educational institution to show:
17	(a) the number of qualified students and
18	the number of legacy students who received tuition scholarships
19	in the prior twelve-month period;
20	(b) the total number of students,
21	including qualified students and legacy students, enrolled in
22	the prior twelve-month period;
23	(c) for each qualified student and each
24	legacy student, the component amounts of the lottery tuition
25	scholarship received and the amount of unmet need that was not
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1	offset by the lottery tuition scholarship;
2	[(c)] <u>(d)</u> for each semester, the amount
3	of tuition scholarships funded and the amount of tuition costs
4	that were not offset by the tuition scholarship; [and
5	(d)] (e) the number of qualified
6	students and the number of legacy students who graduated with a
7	degree and, for each qualified student, the number of
8	consecutive semesters [and nonconsecutive semesters] attended
9	prior to graduation; and
10	(f) the number of qualified students and
11	the number of legacy students who received a lottery tuition
12	scholarship and subsequently became ineligible for a lottery
13	tuition scholarship and the reasons for ineligibility; and
14	(3) any additional information required or
15	requested by the legislative finance committee or the
16	department of finance and administration."
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
