AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS; REQUIRING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO FILL A VACANCY ON A SCHOOL BOARD; PROVIDING FOR ELECTION PROCEDURES; REQUIRING CANDIDATES TO FILE PROOF OF PRIMARY RESIDENCY WITH THEIR DECLARATIONS OF CANDIDACY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the School Election Law is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] SPECIAL ELECTIONS TO FILL VACANCIES.--

A. The board shall by resolution issue a public proclamation in Spanish and English calling a special school district election to fill a vacancy on the board within the school district within ten days of the occurrence of the vacancy. The election shall be held within thirty days of issuance of the proclamation. The proclamation shall be filed .206229.1

24	A. A candidate for a board position that will be

declaration of candidacy with the proper filing officer during the period commencing at 9:00 a.m. on the third Tuesday in December of the even-numbered year immediately preceding the date of the regular school district election and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the same day.

- B. A candidate for a board position that will be filled at a special school district election to fill a vacancy shall file a declaration of candidacy with the proper filing officer during the period commencing at 9:00 a.m. seven days following publication of the proclamation and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the same day.
- C. A candidate for a board position shall submit proof to the county clerk that the candidate's primary residence is located within the school district when the candidate files a declaration of candidacy.
- [B.] D. A candidate shall file for only one board position during a filing period.
- [C.] E. Whoever knowingly makes a false statement in a declaration of candidacy is guilty of a fourth degree felony and shall be sentenced pursuant to the provisions of Section 31-18-15 NMSA 1978."
- Section 22-5-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967, SECTION 3. Chapter 16, Section 32, as amended) is amended to read:
 - "22-5-9. [LOCAL] SCHOOL BOARD VACANCIES.--

[local] school board shall be filled at [an open meeting, at which a quorum of the membership is present, by a majority vote of the remaining members appointing a qualified elector to fill the vacancy] a special election held within thirty days of the occurrence of the vacancy.

- A qualified elector [appointed] elected to fill a vacancy occurring in the membership of a [local] school board shall hold that office [until the next regular school district election when an election shall be held to fill the vacancy] for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- [If a qualified elector is not appointed to fill the vacancy within forty-five days from the date the vacancy occurred, the department shall appoint a qualified elector to fill the vacancy until the next regular school district election.
- D. In the event vacancies occur in a majority of the full membership of a local school board, the department shall appoint qualified electors to fill the vacancies. Those persons appointed shall hold office until the next regular school district election when an election shall be held to fill the vacancies for the unexpired terms. | Special elections to fill a vacancy on the school board shall be conducted pursuant to the School Election Law."
