20	A. Unlawful carrying of a firearm on state capitol

New Mexico in accordance with the Concealed Handgun Carry Act;
 provided that the handgun is concealed.

B. A person who commits unlawful carrying of a firearm on state capitol premises is guilty of a misdemeanor.

C. Unlawful discharge of a firearm on state capitol
premises consists of a person who is not a peace officer
discharging a firearm on state capitol premises, unless the
firearm is discharged in justifiable self-defense or
justifiable defense of another.

D. A person who commits unlawful discharge of a firearm on state capitol premises is guilty of a fourth degree felony.

E. For the purposes of this section, "state capitol premises" means the state capitol building, the capitol north building and the interior corridor that connects the two buildings."
