AN ACT

RELATING TO TRADE PRACTICES; AMENDING SECTIONS OF THE PETROLEUM PRODUCTS STANDARDS ACT TO PROVIDE FOR FIVE PERCENT BIODIESEL STANDARDS IN DIESEL FUEL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 57-19-28 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993, Chapter 98, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:

"57-19-28. DUTIES OF THE BOARD--AUTHORITY OF THE DIRECTOR.--

A. The board is responsible for the administration and enforcement of the provisions of the Petroleum Products

Standards Act. The board shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to administer and enforce the provisions of that act. The board shall provide public notice and allow public comment on all proposed rules and regulations.

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В.	The	director	shall	have	the	authority	to:
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- inspect, investigate, analyze and take (1) appropriate actions to administer and enforce the provisions of the Petroleum Products Standards Act;
- (2) enter any commercial premises from which petroleum products are offered for sale during normal business If the premises are not open to the public, the director shall present the director's credentials and enter only with consent from the commercial entity. If no consent is given, the director shall obtain a search warrant;
- collect or cause to be collected samples (3) of petroleum products offered for sale and cause such samples to be tested or analyzed to determine if they are in compliance with the provisions of the Petroleum Products Standards Act and regulations adopted pursuant to that act;
- (4) issue and enforce stop-sale, hold and removal orders with respect to a petroleum product kept, offered or exposed for sale in violation of the provisions of the Petroleum Products Standards Act and regulations adopted pursuant to that act;
- require distributors and retailers to retain records pertaining to petroleum product purchases and sales for a period of not more than one year;
- (6) require retailers to maintain records verifying that diesel fuel sold in New Mexico contains at least .208180.2

five percent biodiesel;

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 $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ (7) maintain and operate a petroleum product testing laboratory to ensure that all petroleum products offered for sale in New Mexico meet standards prescribed in the Petroleum Products Standards Act and regulations adopted pursuant to that act;

 $[\frac{7}{(8)}]$ issue and enforce stop-use orders for measuring equipment or vehicle tanks that are used commercially and that do not conform to the provisions of the Petroleum Products Standards Act and regulations adopted pursuant to that act; and

[(8)] (9) delegate to authorized representatives any of the responsibilities for the proper administration of the Petroleum Products Standards Act.

[C. If in consultation with the secretary of energy, minerals and natural resources and pursuant to regular, periodic monitoring, the director determines that sufficient amounts of biodiesel are not available to meet the requirements of Section 57-19-29 NMSA 1978 or that the price of the biodiesel blend significantly exceeds the price of diesel fuel for at least two months, the director shall suspend those requirements for a period of up to six months.]"

SECTION 2. Section 57-19-29 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993, Chapter 98, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"57-19-29. QUALITY STANDARDS.--

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2 quality standards, tests and methods of conducting analyses on 3 petroleum products manufactured, kept, stored, sold or offered for sale in New Mexico shall be those last adopted and published by the American society for testing and materials or 5 the society of automotive engineers and shall be used to 6 7 determine compliance with the Petroleum Products Standards Act and regulations adopted pursuant to that act. In the absence 8 9 of a petroleum product quality standard, test or method from the American society for testing and materials or the society 10 of automotive engineers, the board may adopt a regulation that 11 12 establishes a quality standard, test or method to conduct analyses on petroleum products. 13 [B. After July 1, 2010 and before July 1, 2012, all 14

Unless modified by regulation of the board, the

diesel fuel sold to state agencies, political subdivisions of the state and public schools for use in motor vehicles on the streets and highways of this state shall contain five percent biodiesel, except that this standard may be temporarily suspended by the director in accordance with Section 57-19-28 NMSA 1978.

C. On or after July 1, 2012, all diesel fuel sold to consumers for use in motor vehicles on the streets and highways of this state shall contain five percent biodiesel, except that this standard may be temporarily suspended by the director in accordance with Section 57-19-28 NMSA 1978.]

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B. Beginning on January 1, 2017 and ending on
December 31, 2022, effective ninety days after the director has
announced in print that all criteria described below have been
met, all diesel fuel offered for sale in New Mexico for use in
notor vehicles on the streets and highways shall contain at
least five percent biodiesel by volume during each of the
months of March through October if the following conditions are
net:

- (1) notice from the director that there is a sufficient supply of biodiesel and infrastructure and protocols are in place to meet anticipated demand; provided that the price of the biodiesel blend does not significantly exceed the price of diesel fuel for at least two months;
- (2) the taxation and revenue department has established a reporting system to the New Mexico department of agriculture of total diesel sales, including biodiesel; and
- (3) the blend stock is certified to meet

 specifications.
- C. The provisions of Subsection B of this section shall be suspended if the director determines:
- (1) biodiesel plants with the capacity to produce fifteen million gallons of biodiesel per year are not located and operating in the state by December 31, 2022;
 - (2) that the necessary biodiesel is

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(3) based on a comparison of New Mexico with markets of adjacent states, that the use of biodiesel would be uneconomic at the time notice is given;

(4) that the in-state biodiesel inventory drops below one month's supply necessary, as reported by the taxation and revenue department, for statewide blending, in which case the director shall issue a waiver for one hundred twenty days, with the director reserving the right to extend the waiver for the balance of the blending season if it is appropriate to do so; or

(5) that the federal renewable fuels standard equals or exceeds five percent of biodiesel by volume."

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
