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AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT; AMENDING THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION ACT; INCLUDING THE PROMOTION OF TOURISM AS A PURPOSE AND DUTY OF THE CORPORATION; MAKING CONFORMING CHANGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 53-7A-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003, Chapter 183, Section 2) is amended to read:

"53-7A-2. PURPOSES. -- The purposes of the Economic Development Corporation Act are to:

- promote, stimulate, develop and advance business, prosperity, employment, [and] economic welfare, tourism and recreational facilities in the state and among its citizens;
- encourage, [and] assist and market the location В. .207235.1

2	the rehabilitation and expansion of existing business, [and]
3	industry and visitors;
4	C. cooperate and act in conjunction with other
5	organizations, public or private, in the promotion and
6	advancement of industrial, commercial, agricultural, [and]
7	recreational and cultural developments in the state; and
8	D. provide for the creation of a nonprofit
9	corporation with the responsibility to work with communities
10	throughout New Mexico in effectuating these purposes in a
11	manner that can be quantified and measured."
12	SECTION 2. Section 53-7A-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
13	Chapter 183, Section 3) is amended to read:
14	"53-7A-3. CORPORATION AUTHORIZEDBOARD OF DIRECTORS
15	ORGANIZATIONLIMITATION OF LIABILITY
16	A. A nonprofit organization to provide economic
17	development <u>and marketing</u> services to the state is authorized
18	to be organized and formed under the provisions of the
19	Nonprofit Corporation Act and the Economic Development
20	Corporation Act.
21	B. The corporation shall be governed by a board of
22	directors composed of fifteen members as follows:
23	(1) the secretary of economic development;
24	(2) the secretary of tourism;

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professional <u>or businessperson</u>, appointed by the governor, from each regional planning district, provided that no more than four of the economic development professionals <u>or</u>

<u>businesspersons</u> shall be members of the same political party;
and

- [\(\frac{(3)}{(4)}\) one tourism professional

 [\(\frac{\text{businessperson}}{\text{pusinessperson}}\), appointed by the governor, from each regional

 [\(\frac{\text{planning}}{\text{planning}}\)] \(\text{marketing}\) district, provided that no more than four of the [\(\frac{\text{professional}}{\text{businesspersons}}\)] \(\text{tourism}\) professionals

 shall be members of the same political party.
- C. The governor shall appoint a chair, and the board of directors shall elect other officers as the board deems necessary.
- D. The board of directors shall adopt bylaws, in accordance with the provisions of the Nonprofit Corporation Act, governing the conduct of the corporation in the performance of its duties under the Economic Development Corporation Act.
- E. The board of directors shall hire a president, who shall be the chief administrative officer of the corporation and be responsible for its operations.
- F. A director, the president or another officer shall not be personally liable for any damages resulting from:
- (1) any negligent act or omission of an employee of the corporation;

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- (2) any negligent act or omission of another director or officer of the corporation; or
- (3) any action taken as a director or officer or a failure to take any action as a director or officer unless the director or officer has breached or failed to perform the duties of [his] office and the breach or failure to perform constitutes willful misconduct or recklessness."
- SECTION 3. Section 53-7A-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003, Chapter 183, Section 4) is amended to read:

"53-7A-4. CORPORATION--POWERS.--The corporation shall have the powers conferred upon domestic nonprofit corporations by the Nonprofit Corporation Act unless otherwise specified in the Economic Development Corporation Act and shall also have the power to:

- A. sue and be sued in its corporate name;
- B. purchase, take, receive or otherwise acquire; own, hold, dispose of or use; and otherwise deal in and with property, including an interest in or ownership of intangible personal property, intellectual property or technological innovations;
- C. sell, convey, pledge, exchange, transfer or otherwise dispose of its assets and properties for consideration upon terms and conditions that the corporation shall determine;
- D. make contracts, incur liabilities or borrow .207235.1

3	instruments necessary or convenient in the exercise of the							
4	powers and functions granted the corporation by the Economic							
5	Development Corporation Act;							
6	F. receive and administer grants, contracts and							
7	private gifts;							
8	G. invest and reinvest its funds;							
9	H. conduct its activities, carry on its operations,							
10	have offices and exercise the powers granted by the Economic							
11	Development Corporation Act;							
12	I. employ officers and employees that it deems							
13	necessary, set their compensation and prescribe their duties;							
14	J. enter into agreements with insurance carriers to							
15	insure against any loss in connection with its operations;							
16	K. authorize retirement programs and other benefits							
17	for salaried officers and employees of the corporation; and							
18	L. contract with economic development, marketing							
19	and tourism experts and other experts and consultants that may							
20	be required and to fix and pay their compensation."							
21	SECTION 4. Section 53-7A-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,							
22	Chapter 183, Section 5) is amended to read:							
23	"53-7A-5. CORPORATIONDUTIESPursuant to policies
