AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS; PROHIBITING CERTAIN CANDIDATES AND STATE OFFICERS FROM SOLICITING SRC→OR ACCEPTING←SRC CONTRIBUTIONS DURING A PROHIBITED PERIOD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 1-19-34.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993, Chapter 46, Section 12, as amended) is amended to read:

"1-19-34.1. LEGISLATIVE SESSION FUNDRAISING PROHIBITION.--

A. It is unlawful during the prohibited period for .212270.2

For purposes of this subsection, "prohibited period" means that period beginning January 1 prior to any regular session of the legislature or, in the case of a special session, after the proclamation has been issued, and ending on adjournment of the regular or special session.

B. It is unlawful during the prohibited period for the governor <u>or the lieutenant governor</u>, or any agent on [his] <u>the governor's or the lieutenant governor's</u> behalf, to knowingly solicit <u>SRC→or accept</u>←SRC a contribution [for a political purpose] governed by the Campaign Reporting Act</u>. For purposes of this subsection, "prohibited period" means that period beginning January 1 prior to any regular session of the legislature or, in the case of a special session, after the .212270.2
